Whereas the results of the calculation of true costs indicate that the offer presented by the firm Marchés Mondiaux CIBC Inc. is the most beneficial;

It is proposed by Councillor Claude P. Lemire And unanimously resolved by all councillors:

That the preamble of the present resolution forms an integral part as if it were reproduced in its entirety.

That the issuance of banknotes in the amount of \$ 2 743 000 to the Municipality be awarded to the firm Marchés Mondiaux CIBC Inc.;

That a request be presented to them in order to mandate the Service de dépôt et de compensation CDS Inc. (CDS) for the registration pertaining to this issuance.

That CDS act in the name of registering agent in the account, holding bond agent, paying agent and responsible for transactions to be made regarding its members as described in the draft agreement signed between the Minister of municipal affairs and CDS.

That CDS proceed with the transfer of funds according to the legal requirements of the bonds, for this purpose, Council authorizes the Director general and Secretary-treasurer to sign the document required by the Canadian banking system entitled 'Autorisation pour le plan de debits préautorisés destines aux entreprises'.

That the Mayor and the Director general and Secretary-treasurer be authorized to sign the bonds specified by this issuance, specifically bonds with due dates.

207.08.18 SEQUENCE, SHORT TERM AND EXTENSION RESOLUTION REGARDING A LOAN BY BANKNOTES IN THE AMOUNT OF \$ 2 743 000 WHICH WILL BE DONE ON AUGUST 22ND, 2018

Whereas that in accordance to the following borrowing by-laws for the amounts indicated for each one, the Municipality of Morin-Heights would like to issue a series of bonds, specifically, bonds with due dates for a total amount of \$ 2 743 000 which will be made on August 22nd, 2018, divided as follows;

Whereas, consequently, there is a need to modify these borrowing by-laws;

Whereas, according to the 1st paragraph of Article 2 of the Municipal loans and debts Act (RLRQ, chapter D-7), in order to issue these bonds and for borrowing by-laws number 491-2012, 521-2015, 517-2014 et 548-2016, the Municipality of Morin-Heights would like to issue a shorter term that the one originally set for these by-laws;

Whereas the Municipality of Morin-Heights had on August 21st, 2018, a loan in the amount of \$ 1 330,000, on an original loan of \$ 1 954,000 pertaining to the financing of borrowing by-laws number 433, 400 and 491-2012;

Whereas that, as of August 21st, 2018, this by-law has not been renewed;

Whereas the issuance of banknotes which will be done on August 22nd, 2018 includes the amounts required for refinancing;

Whereas consequently and in accordance to the 2nd paragraph of Article 2 above, the due date for borrowing by-laws 433, 400 and 491-2012 must be extended;

It is proposed by Councillor Claude P. Lemire And unanimously resolved by all councillors:

That the borrowing by-laws in the 1st paragraph of the preamble be financed by banknotes, in accordance to the following:

- 1. the banknotes, specifically a banknote with due date, will be dated August 22nd, 2018;
- 2. interests will be payable bi-annually, on February 22nd and August 22nd of each year;
- 3. les obligations ne seront pas rachetables par anticipation; toutefois, elles pourront être rachetées avec le consentement des détenteurs conformément à la Loi sur les dettes et les emprunts municipaux (RLRQ, chapitre D-7);
- les obligations seront immatriculées au nom de Service de dépôt et de compensation CDS inc. (CDS) et seront déposées auprès de CDS;
- CDS will act in the name of its members as registering agent to the account, registered holder of the banknotes, paying agent responsible for transactions to be made for its members, as described in the draft agreement signed by the Quebec Minister of municipal affairs and CDS;
- 6. That CDS proceed with the transfer of funds according to the legal requirements of the bonds, for this purpose, Council authorizes the Director general to sign the document required by the Canadian banking system entitled 'Autorisation pour le plan de debits préautorisés destines aux entreprises'.
- 7. CDS will make the payments in capital and interests to the members by electronic transfers and for this purpose, CDS will directly withdraw the required amounts from the following account:

8. That the banknotes be signed by the Mayor and Secretary-treasurer. The Municipality of Morin-Heights, as permitted by Law, has mandated CDS in order to act as authenticate financial agent and the banknotes will enter into effect once they will have been authenticated.

Whereas, with regards to annual capital amortizations planned for 2024 and following, the term stipulated in borrowing by-laws number 491-2012, 521-2015, 517-2014 and 548-2016 be shorter than the one originally set, specifically, for a term of five (5) years (as of August 22nd, 2018) instead of the term stipulated for said amortizations, each subsequent issuance being for the balance or part of the balance due on the loan;

That, as for the banknotes loan of August 22nd, 2018, the original term for borrowing by-laws 433, 400 and 491-2012, extended for **1** day.

Whereas pursuant to the reorganizing of the offices of the real estate evaluation department, the MRC no longer has the necessary space to store these dossiers:

Whereas, as per the Act respecting municipal taxation municipal as well as the Act respecting archives, local municipalities own their evaluation role;

It is proposed by Councillor Louise Cossette And unanimously resolved by all councillors:

That Council authorize the shredding of the 'paper version' of the property evaluation records by Groupe Gagnon as per the price previously negotiated by the MRC for all municipalities (\$ 3.95 per box and a fee of \$ 1.50 per box for decollating).

211.08.18 ECOLOGICAL DONATION – RIVIÈRE À SIMON, LOT 3 735 741

Considering the Municipality has received an offer to donate lot 3 735 741 having a surface area of 38 695.5 sq.meters from the firm IMMO MC Inc.;

Considering this lot is adjacent to lot 6 156 021 which pertains to a donation to the Town of Saint-Sauveur;

Considering these properties are located along the Simon River near Bel-Air road in Saint-Sauveur;

Considering the donor wants this donation to be listed within the ministère du Développement durable, Environnement et Lutte contre les changements climatiques (MDDELCC) du Québec et d'Environnement et Changement Climatique Canada (ECCC)'s ecological donation program. This donor would like for this property to be preserved in its natural state in perpetuity for the benefit of present and future generations;

Considering the costs relating to this donation will be paid for by the beneficiary including a certified evaluator's evaluation costs, notary and surveyor fees and ecological characterization;

It is proposed by Councillor Leigh MacLeod And unanimously resolved by all councillors:

That Council accept the donation of lot 3 735 471 from the cadastre of Quebec.

That Council agree to the vocation proposed by the donor, specifically:

The goal of this donation is to maintain and preserve this property in its natural state in perpetuity without any form of commercial exploitation for the benefit of collectivity for future generations.

The property may be used to promote scientific and outdoor type activities.

That Council authorize the issuance of a receipt for financial reasons.

That the Director general be authorized to do whatever is necessary in this dossier.

That the Mayor and Director general be authorized to sign for and in the municipality's name.

212.08.18 OLD SETTLER'S WEST

Considering the Municipality has informed the property owners on Old Settlers west road of its agreement, by resolution 278.10.16 dated October 12th, 2016 to undertake the work of loading the minimum gravel and of the road's maintenance during the winter;

Considering the Municipality has informed the property owners, by resolution 153.06.17, dated June 14th, 2017 that a decision must be taken regarding making the road private and specifically a municipal road as per the norms in effect;

Considering that at the time of the meeting of August 20th, 2017, the Mayor and Councillor Jean Dutil presented the property owners with options and agreed that basic work would be done to the road awaiting a decision from the property owners with regards to the tenure of the road;

Considering the property owners are presently discussing the possibility of the road becoming private and ask the Municipality, by letter dated August 2nd, that the Municipality participate in the privatization project rendering Old Settlers road roadworthy before transferring ownership;

Considering the Municipality considers that the privatization of Old Settlers west road will allow the property owners of the area to preserve the forestry character of the area;

It is proposed by councillor Jean Dutil And unanimously resolved:

That Council notify the local property owners on Old Settlers west road that the Municipality agrees to undertake the work on the ditches, the removal of rocks from the road and the supply and levelling of 200 mm of gravel while respecting as much as possible, the actual width of the road.

That this work will be done should the group of property owners approve the privatization of the road.

216.08.18 ADOPTION OF BY-LAW 556-2018 REGARDING LIGHTING ON AUGUSTA, BALMORAL AND GLEN ABBEY ROADS

The Director General gives a summary of the by-law.

It is proposed by Councillor Jean Dutil
And unanimously resolved by all councillors:

That council adopt By-law 556-2018 regarding lighting on Augusta, Balmoral and Glen Abbey roads as follows:

By-law 556-2018 Regarding lighting on Augusta, Balmoral and Glen Abbey roads

Considering the Domaine Balmoral property owners association have presented the Municipality with a project regarding streetlights for Augusta, Balmoral and Glen Abbey roads;

Considering such a project aims at promoting safety and showcasing the area;

Considering the entire Domaine is subdivided and that these lots cannot be subdivided because of the minimum required surface area;

Considering all streetlights will be integrated into the Municipality's public streetlight network;

Considering the majority of area's property owners have approved the project;

Considering a notice of motion for this by-law was given at the regular council meeting of July 11th, 2018 with the exemption of its reading by Councillor Peter MacLaurin;

Considering the draft by-law was presented at its regular Council meeting of July 11th, 2018;

THAT THE FOLLOWING BE STATUED AND ORDAINED BY THE PRESENT BY-LAW, as follows:

The preamble forms an integral part of the present by-law.

ARTICLE 1

Council decrees an expense not exceeding the amount of \$57,900 for the applying of the present by-law, specifically the purchase and installation of streetlights on Augusta, Balmoral and Glen Abbey roads and in order to obtain this amount, authorizes a loan by banknotes for the same amount for a period of 10 years; the estimated quote dated July 3rd, 2018 prepared by the Director general, Mr. Yves Desmarais, attached herewith as Annex A forming an integral part hereof.

ARTICI F 2

If any of the appropriations of the present by-law is more than the expense made pertaining to this appropriation, Council is authorized to use this surplus to pay for other expenses decreed by the present by-law and for which the estimate is proved to be insufficient.

ARTICLE 3

In order to provide for the expenses committed pertaining to interests and reimbursement in capital of the annual due date of the loan, is by the present by-law levied each year during the term of the loan from each of the 82 taxable properties located on Augusta, Balmoral and Glen Abbey roads, as shown on the plan of roads and the list of properties attached herewith as Annex B of the present by-law forming an integral part hereof, a compensation for each taxable property for which he is the owner.

The amount of this compensation will be established annually by dividing the allocated expenses with regards to interests and the reimbursement of capital on the annual due dates of the loan by the number of taxable properties for which the property owners are subject to the payment of this compensation.

ARTICLE 4

ADTICLE 6

Every taxpayer of properties on which a tax will be levied as per Article 4 may have this property exempt of this tax by paying the amount of the capital of this loan in one instalment before the first issuance of this loan or any other subsequent issuance, if applicable, which would be provided by the required compensation as per said article.

The payment must be made within thirty days of the issuance of the notice sent by the Municipality and forwarded by mail to taxpayers concerned by the present by-law. The special tax will be levied by the present by-law and deducted in accordance. This payment must be made as per Article 1072.1 of the Quebec municipal Code.

A payment made before the above-mentioned term exempts the property from the special tax for the remainder of the term of the loan set by the bylaw.
