- Exemption of the special infrastructure tax for the « Village » drinking water network for a period of fifteen years
- No connection fees to the drinking water network
- Payment to the owner of an amount of
  - \$ 10 000 \$ for the connection to the network and the transfer of the present well located on the property

These exemptions will be cancelled if the property is sold before the end of the specified period.

#### 14.01.09 GRANT APPLICATION – INTERMUNICIPAL POOL

WHEREAS St-Sauveur, Piedmont and Morin-Heights have a common project to build an indoor inter-municipal pool;

WHEREAS the budgeted sum for such a project is estimated at \$ 6 600 000;

WHEREAS the town of St-Sauveur has been mandated to manage the aforementioned project;

WHEREAS there is grounds to submit a grant application to the *Ministère de l'Éducation, du Loisir et du Sport* to carry out this project;

Consequently,

It is proposed by Councillor Mona Wood and unanimously resolved :

That the St-Sauveur's General Director be mandated to submit in the three municipalities' names (St-Sauveur, Piedmont and Morin-Heights), a \$ 3 300 000 grant request to the *Ministère de l'Éducation, du Loisir et du Sport* out of the *Fonds pour le développement du sport et de l'activité physique* for carrying out the construction of a semi-Olympic indoor intermunicipal pool.

That after obtaining a financial contribution of 50% from the *Ministère de l'Éducation, du Loisir et du Sport,* the Municipality of Morin-Heights will be committed to pay its share of admissible costs and recurrent operating costs subject to the approval of the borrowing by-law by the citizens

#### **15.01.09** VOLUNTEER TRIBUTE PRIZE

Considering that the MRC des Pays-d'en-Haut's council adopted, at its meeting of December 9th, resolution number CM 264-12-08 which presents the candidacy of Mrs. Diane Raymond, who is the president of the Garde Manger des Pays-d'en-Haut as well as the organization to the Volunteer-Quebec tribute prize.

It is unanimously resolved:

That Council support the MRC des Pays-d'en-Haut's inititative and support Mrs. Diane Raymond's candidacy as well as the organization itself for the Volunteer-Quebec tribute prize.
