## News from the Mayor

Fellow citizens,

I am getting vaccinated tomorrow! Like many of you, it is now my turn, and I am very happy to have reached this step towards a return to our normal lives. Since we are all tired of hearing about the pandemic, I have decided to reconnect with tradition and inform you of our summer activities!

If our provincial and federal government grants are made available, repair work to chemin Watchorn should begin over the summer. There will also be major roadwork on chemin Corbeil and rue des Bouleaux.

Council developed a strategy to control speeding, which consists of adding mandatory stop signs at strategic locations, adding four additional speed signs and better coordination with the *Sûreté du Québec*. Bollards installed during the summer of 2020 were deemed effective and will return this summer. Operations aimed at countering the noise from modified vehicles will also be undertaken by the SQ.

Very soon, there will be exciting additions to Basler Park. We will be installing a synthetic surface onto the large skating rink to create two tennis courts. The small skating rink will be paved to offer pickleball courts. You will be able to reserve your time slots with the Recreation Department as soon as the courts are ready. As of now, the date is still undetermined but check our website or Facebook page for further information. Once again this summer, Lummis Park will only be accessible to Morin-Heights residents as vaccinations are still underway. Furthermore, we invite you to register online to obtain a citizen's card, which will facilitate your access to this park (see p.15).

Since we cannot predict the public health measures that will be in effect during our usual July 1<sup>st</sup> festivities, we are planning instead to present fireworks on June 24<sup>th</sup> and July 1<sup>st</sup>, at 22:00. The fireworks will start from a strategic point that should allow the vast majority of our residents to see them from their homes! Also, on July 1<sup>st</sup>, we will animate the village with ephemeral shows. No details will be disclosed to avoid crowds; the lucky ones who will be there at the right time will be the only spectators!

We have high hopes that Superfolk will be held outdoor in Basler Park in August. Ian Kelly and his team are hard at work to make this happen and are also organizing various small shows throughout the summer. Also in August, we will be welcoming a unique dance festival, the Festival Tournant.

Our major project is the renewal of the Urbanism Plan. It is the basis of all development and orientations of our community. The draft plan will have been presented to Council by the end of April, and public consultations will be held in May and June and will probably be underway by the time you read these lines. Council's objective is to preserve as much wooded area as possible and to do so, will increase the surface area of lots to be developed. Morin-Heights' popularity is undeniable, and the pandemic exacerbated the exodus of those living in the city towards the country. We welcome them but intend on maintaining our vision for the outdoors and avoid housing densification. We look forward to hearing from you regarding this matter and invite you to write to us expressing your point of view at the time of the consultations.

I wish you a wonderful summer filled with outdoor activities and health!

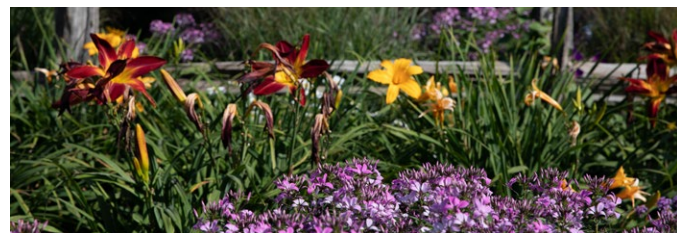

# Town Planning and Environment

## Are you planning on doing any construction work during the summer season? If so, do you have your permit?

We want to remind you that the issuance of a permit or a certificate of authorization is required prior to the undertaking of any work. The Town Planning Department is here to inform you of the regulations currently in force and assist you with your projects.

Since we are currently receiving a very high number of applications, we suggest that you submit your permit applications in advance. Furthermore, to not delay the process of issuing your permits, please make sure to submit a complete application that includes all the documents required in accordance with the type of permit requested. On the Municipality's website, you can find all our permit application forms, as well as the regulations in force.

Finally, we thank you in advance for your understanding of the possible delays in processing your requests, considering that some services are provided remotely at the moment.

## Car Shelters

Winter is over! It is time to dismantle your temporary car shelters. Therefore, we wish to remind you that the municipal regulations stipulate that: the shelter can be maintained during the period between the fifteenth (15<sup>th</sup>) day of October and the first (1<sup>st</sup>) day of May of the following year, but the structure can be installed from the first (1<sup>st</sup>) day of October. It must be removed no later than the fifteenth (15<sup>th</sup>) day of May of the following year.

## Outdoor Storage

In a municipality like Morin-Heights, with nearly 5,000 inhabitants, everyone must do their part to preserve its beauty! Among the rules to follow, one of the most important concerns waste and outdoor storage. We remind you that outdoor storage of any waste, objects, materials, or other is strictly prohibited in residential areas. Maintaining the cleanliness of your property ensures a good neighbouring practice, a quality living environment and supports the beautification of the Morin-Heights landscape!

Despite the current health crisis, we wish to remind you that municipal regulations still apply! Don't be surprised to see our friendly inspectors out on the road this summer!

## Current Operating Mode

Free access inside the library is allowed and the use of one of the computer stations. Considering the size of the building, the number of people allowed inside is ten, of which seven are permitted in the library room (not including the team of workers). When this limit is reached, visitors will have to wait outside. Social distancing is mandatory for all, as well as wearing a face covering for visitors aged 10 and over.



## Municipal Library

# Public Works and Infrastructures

## Road Signage and Construction Sites

Various construction sites will be opened for road repair over the summer across the territory. Pay attention to warning road signs and obey the flagman's instructions. He is present to ensure your safety and the safety of our workers. Note that the flagman has the last word on the road and that you are required to respect his authority, as rules and penalties imposed by the Highway Safety Code apply (demerit points may be lost).

Be vigilant and follow instructions!

## Culverts and Private Entrances

Property owners looking to create or move a private entrance, install, or replace a culvert must obtain a permit beforehand. Requests must be submitted at the Town Hall. A deposit is required at the time of the request, which is reimbursable once the project is completed by the owner, inspected, and approved by the Municipality. The owner of a culvert ensures that it is free of stones, branches, and other objects that can obstruct the water flow.

## Ditches

We want to remind residents living on a municipal street that any intervention in a ditch or on the curbside is prohibited, including extending the landscaping (i.e., grass or stone). Ditches are a part of the road's right of way and serve a specific purpose; their primary function is to capture and direct the runoff water. We suggest you leave the natural vegetation intact as much as possible. Backfilling it, lining it with river stones or leaving material of any kind in it is also forbidden, such as grass clippings, branches, wood, sand, etc.

## Watering Lawns, Hedges, Trees, Shrubs, Flower Beds and Gardens

**The Town Planning and Environment Department can issue a special authorization for a new lawn upon request.**

## Reduce Your Water Consumption

Quebecers are sadly world champions of water consumption, and Morinheighters on municipal water networks are no exception. Over the summer, the average consumption in litres per person doubles, if not triples at times. Washing vehicles and various surfaces require a lot of water, but excessive lawn watering is by far the activity that consumes the most. Therefore, it is vital that you respect the fixed watering schedule prescribed in By-law 542 2016 concerning outdoor use of drinking water, available on the municipal website (or see table above).

The Municipality wishes to raise awareness regarding the use of drinking water. In addition to trying to attain the goal set by the province to **reduce by 20% the average production of water per person**, your efforts will also reduce the demand on our distribution networks, help preserve a natural resource essential to life and amount to collective and individual savings.

# Morin-Heights Fire Department and First Responders



## Civic Number

A building's civic number is not a decorative or useful element only for the mail. This number is the primary reference for the quick location of a place by emergency responders, day or night.

A clearly visible civic number allows emergency services to locate a building more quickly, thus saving significant delays.

## Cigarette Butts

Never throw your cigarette butts into a flowerpot, garden or flower bed. Many soils are enriched with chemical fertilizers or other combustible substances, and a cigarette butt can burn for more than three hours, so you could easily start a fire.



- / Always put out your butts in an ashtray or in a non-combustible container (e.g. can) filled with sand or water.
- / Place the ashtray on a stable surface, away from any flammable object.
- / Make sure all butts are put out before emptying the ashtray.

## BBQ

A propane or natural gas barbecue is a safe appliance, but there are risks of injury, explosion and fire. To learn more about its use, maintenance and storage, consult this link:

## Open Fires

Before lighting an open fire, first check with your municipality to see if open fires are allowed in your area. Also, check with SOPFEU for current restrictions. If there are no restrictions in your town, follow these guidelines:

- / I understand that only ONE fire is allowed on a lot.
- / The fire must be completely extinguished with water before leaving the premises.
- / Burning of construction materials or debris as well as leaves, needles, grass clippings or yard trimmings is prohibited.
- / It is forbidden to use toxic materials to start a fire (tires, gasoline, oil).
- / The fire must not cause any inconvenience to neighbouring buildings (smoke, soot, volatile debris, etc.).

# Outdoor Network

## Dogs

A dispenser for dog waste bags will be installed at Basler Park.

Dogs must be on a leash at all times. It is important to bring your bags back and not leave them in the woods.

## Hiking

Access to Basler Park and Bouleaux Park (snow-shoeing trails) is free for hiking. Please note that the winter trails located at Sommet Morin Heights are closed during the summer season.

## Condition of Trails

## Parking

Street parking is prohibited at all times, as well as on private lots adjacent to the parks. You must use the municipal parking lots near the various trail networks.

## Respect of Private Property

It is important to note that the closed trails may be located on private property. Therefore, it is forbidden to use them outside of the operating season since we do not have the necessary authorizations.

## Construction in the Mountain Bike Network

It is forbidden to build modules, obstacles, or new trails without the approval of the Municipality.

## Lummis Park

- / Access reserved for Morin-Heights residents as of June 24, 2021
- / Attendant at the park entrance gate
- / Citizen card or proof of residency required, maximum of five non-resident guests allowed
- / Dogs are not allowed

## Mountain Biking

A fee is now required to use the mountain bike network to support the maintenance of the network. However, we will announce in more detail in a subsequent bulletin that the cross-country ski pass for Morin-Heights residents will be reduced in price. Thus, a Morinheighter practicing cross-country skiing and mountain biking, will pay for both passes an amount equivalent or similar to what the cross-country ski pass cost last winter.

**If you had a cross-country ski pass for the 2020-2021 season, email your contact information and pass number to [chaletbellevue@morinheights.com](mailto:chaletbellevue@morinheights.com), and we will convert your cross-country ski pass to a mountain bike pass at no charge! The pass will be available the next day at Basler Park.**

**Please respect the 24-hour rule after a heavy rain to preserve the condition of the trails, as well as the signage regarding closed trails.**

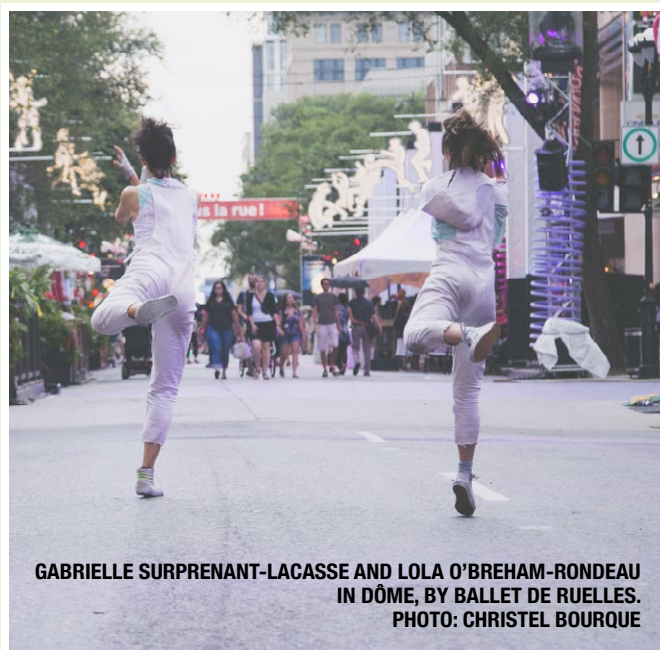
