News from the Mayor



Dear fellow citizens,

Summer is just around the corner and here is an overview of the activities, events and work that will be on the menu.

The online public consultation on the future of the

Castel Marie property is over, and the Council will take the time to analyze all of the comments before proposing a long-term vision. However, we will soon be proceeding with the construction of a small parking area and the installation of picnic tables so that everyone can enjoy this wonderful space as soon as possible. The Children's Fishing Day, Environment Day and the Mayor's BBQ will all be held on the site on Saturday, June 8, and we invite you to attend in large numbers.

The next stage of the project to install decorative lighting and street furniture on chemin du Village and chemin du Lac-Écho will be carried out in early summer thanks to a grant from the federal government and will constitute the first stage in the revitalization of the village centre. You can view the revitalization plan on the citizen portal. (https://citoyen.morinheights.com)

Traditional Morin-Heights events such as Canada Day, Shakespeare-in-the-Park and the Superfolk Festival will be held this summer, and we're all hoping the weather will cooperate! For the second year in a row, we'll also be presenting a series of concerts at Lummis Park. You will be able to see the Batucada orchestra, Anita Jade Turcotte, Éric Bégin, the Barockers and many others. Keep an eye on our official communication tools to make sure you don't miss a thing!

The construction of Habitat Morin-Heights' 30unit project for seniors aged 75 and over or with a slight loss of autonomy is well underway, and we invite interested parties to complete the intention form. The form can be picked up at Town Hall and returned there by June 7. Units will be allocated in July for gradual move-in between November 2024 and January 2025.

Other major work this summer will include repairs to the Lac-Peter dam and the reconstruction of a section of chemin Blue Hills. The MTQ will also be paving Route 364 between Morin-Heights and Saint-Sauveur. In terms of road repair subsidies, 2023 was a good year for our municipality. This is not the case in 2024, but we will renew our grant requests in 2025.

In closing, I wish everyone a summer filled with outdoor activities, music and culture. We have an exceptional community; we just have to take advantage of it!

Keep your membership card

Remember to retain your membership card, which is valid for two years. It is essential to renew your cross-country ski/snowshoe passes next year. Your passes can be downloaded directly onto your membership card. A \$5 fee is charged for any card lost and renewed before its expiry date.

Statistics

We track the frequency of use of our recreational services among different user groups (residents, non-residents, etc.). Therefore, when you arrive at our parks or our patrol comes across you on the trail, you will be asked to show them your membership card and tell them what activity you participated in. This will allow us to gather a more detailed statistical portrait to help us improve our services.

Communicating with your neighbours: the key to good cohabitation!

Are you disturbed by a neighbour's actions? Talk it over with them first. Explain the various things that are bothering you and affecting your quality of life. It's possible that they never even thought it could bother you. Every year, the Municipality receives numerous complaints about neighbourhood nuisances. Before filing a complaint or calling the Municipality or the police, we encourage you to talk to your neighbours. Here are a few tips and tricks to help you maintain harmony with your neighbours:

Parties and Swimming Pools

Are the neighbourhood's kids all hanging out at the neighbour's pool? Summer is for playing! Be indulgent.

Is your little one turning 10, and you are planning a party with friends and family? Notify your neighbours and make sure your gathering isn't too noisy.

If your party with friends goes on into the evening, be respectful of your neighbours by turning down the volume and the music.

Animals

Is your dog practicing its vocalizations, or is he such a good watchdog that he'll alert you by barking at the slightest insect movement? Calm him down gently, or bring him into your home. Your neighbours will appreciate it.

International Environment Day

International Environment Day, held every year on June 5, brings together millions of people around the world and encourages everyone to participate in efforts to protect and restore the Earth. This year marks the fiftieth anniversary of the event.

This day highlights the urgent environmental challenges of our time. This international day has become the world's largest platform for environmental awareness, with millions of people from all over the world pledging to protect the planet.

Simple, everyday gestures can go a long way towards protecting the environment. Here are just a few that will help you become an eco-responsible citizen.

- Master the recovery of recyclable materials and ensure proper composting with the aim of becoming a zero-waste enthusiast.
- Make your own household products and cosmetics.
- Reduce food waste.
- Renaturalize your land.
- Voluntary conservation.
- Adopt or continue basic water consumption habits:
 - purchase a rainwater collection barrel;
 - wash your dishes with a sink full of water rather than with the tap running continuously;
 - turn off the tap when brushing your teeth, washing your hands, shaving, etc.;
 - install aerators on faucets;
 - limit the time spent in the shower and prefer showering to bathing;
 - when cleaning, use a bucket rather than a continuously running tap;
 - put a jug of water in the fridge for cold water instead of leaving the tap running.

Maintenance of Your Septic System

To keep your septic system in good condition, in addition to emptying your tank and periodically maintaining the purification system, we advise you not to flush these materials down the toilet, sink, or any other drain connected to the domestic sewer system.

- Hair
- Fats: cooking fats, oils, etc.
- Diapers
- Earmuffs, dental floss
- Paper towels
- Make-up remover or baby wipes
- Dryer wipes
- Hazardous materials such as paint, gasoline, motor oil, acid, etc.
- Pieces of fabric: linen, washcloths, clothing, etc.
- Bandages, plasters, medicines, etc.
- Small toys
- Sanitary towels and tampons

All these objects can clog pipes and cause damage to installations such as pumps, and eventually cause sewer backups in residences.

Outdoor Fireplace

With the arrival of good weather and roasted marshmallow season, make sure that the installation of your outdoor fireplace is compliant. If you have a regulatory outdoor fireplace, you can light a fire, even if SOPFEU restrictions are in force in your municipality.

To be regulatory, your outdoor fireplace must:

- be installed on a non-combustible surface (paved, open dirt or gravel floor);
- be installed at least 4.5 metres from buildings and structures attached to them and at least 3 metres from trees, hedges, or any other combustible materials;
- and be equipped with a spark arrestor whose openings have a maximum dimension of 1 cm.

In addition, it is strictly forbidden to fuel or maintain a fire with an accelerant.





Open Fires

An open fire is a fire burning freely like a campfire on the ground. Before lighting an open fire, first, check that no restrictions are in force. Also, check the current SOPFEU restrictions. If there are no restrictions in your municipality, follow these instructions:

- make sure to obtain your burning permit from the municipality's website: www.morinheights.com/ Burning-Permit-request;
- prepare an open area on mineral soil without combustible materials (leaves, grass or other);
- move away all propane gas cylinders and other combustibles;
- light a fire with a maximum dimension of 1 metre by 1 metre;
- monitor the fire at all times and always have water nearby;
- extinguish the fire by pouring water thoroughly and mixing the embers;
- before leaving the premises, check that there is no heat source.

Please note that the **Fire Safety Department** will conduct its prevention visits from the beginning of July until the end of August.

Smoke Alarm Prevention Program

As every summer season, our firefighters will form a fire prevention team with the aim of carrying out residential visits in a targeted area. They will check smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors. Our team will be identifiable by the municipality uniform and will travel in the emergency vehicle of our fire safety service.

Are you absent during our visit? No problem, our team will leave a door hanger, which can be filled out by the owner and returned by mail or directly to the Town Hall.

Forest Fire

Forest fires are frequent in Quebec and are often caused by humans. If you are an outdoor enthusiast or live in a forested area, you should take preventive measures to avoid starting forest fires. These can cause considerable material loss and even death.

It is important to:

- respect municipal regulations relating to outdoor fires at all times;
- do not smoke in or near the forest;
- check if a notice prohibiting the lighting of open fires is in force in your area.

For more information and to know what to do before, during and after a forest fire, you can consult the "Forest fire" page of the government of Quebec or the SOPFEU website. SOPFEU is the organization responsible for the prevention of human-caused forest fires as well as the detection and extinction of forest fires in Quebec.

Respect of Private Property

It is important to note that the closed trails may be located on private property. Therefore, using them outside the operating season is forbidden since we do not have the necessary authorizations.



Unauthorized Development

Building modules, obstacles, or new trails in the mountain bike network is forbidden without the approval of the Municipality.

Hiking

The hiking trail network at Basler Park and Bouleaux Park (snowshoeing trails only) is free for all users.

Trail Conditions

You can check the status of the trails on the municipal website: www.morinheights.com/Outdoors. Please respect the 24-hour rule after heavy rain to preserve the trails' condition and respect the signage regarding closed trails.

Parking

Street parking is always prohibited, as well as on private lots adjacent to the parks. You must use the municipal parking lots near the various trail networks.


