

Summer is approaching – Reminder of new regulations for residential pools

With the arrival of the beautiful season, we would like to remind our citizens about the importance of safety around residential pools. The **new provincial regulation on residential pool safety** now applies to **all pools**, regardless of their **installation year**.

Please note:

- Pools installed before November 1, 2010, which were previously exempt, must be brought up to code by September 30, 2025.
- All other pools must already comply with current requirements.

We encourage all property owners to consult the full regulation on the **Government of Quebec** website by visiting www.quebec.ca and searching for "**Regulation on Residential Pool Safety**."

To ensure compliance with the current standards and to guarantee everyone's safety, the Town Planning and Environmental Services team will be inspecting pool installations within our territory.

Morin-Heights and Climate Change

Morin-Heights will not be spared from climate change. Its consequences are already being felt, particularly on the environment. Although the Municipality has already begun adapting some of its practices, it is preparing to face significant changes. Both permanent and seasonal residents can also support the town in this effort.

New climatic conditions will bring rising air and water temperatures, changing winter conditions, extreme precipitation, thunderstorms, and strong winds.

The potential environmental impacts of these weather events will be numerous. In the short term, the most significant threats include the migration and proliferation of invasive exotic species, accelerated erosion, landslides, and an increase in the transport of contaminants and sediments into rivers and lakes.

Recreational tourism activities, which make Morin-Heights a prime destination for enjoying nature, may be disrupted by unpredictable weather, extreme events, and, at times, limited accessibility. The accelerated degradation of hiking trails, mountain biking paths, and cross-country skiing routes will make their maintenance challenging and could even compromise some activities.

Residents can help the Municipality in its efforts to adapt to climate change through their

actions. You have the power to contribute by becoming fully aware of this phenomenon and helping nature fulfill its role.

First and foremost, consider keeping your property as natural as possible, allowing it to serve its intrinsic purpose. Your primary action should be to preserve and even encourage natural vegetation cover by caring for native understory plants rather than introduced species. In doing so, you will create habitats for birds and pollinating insects.

Another key action is to reduce erosion by promoting water infiltration into natural areas. This will decrease runoff into roadside ditches and help replenish the groundwater table that supplies your wells.

For those living near lakes and waterways, remember that reducing sediment runoff and preserving riparian buffers are the most effective ways to protect your water bodies from degradation.

Finally, keep in mind that the best way to protect nature is to understand it and care for it while minimizing interference.

Public Works and Infrastructures

ROAD SIGNAGE AND CONSTRUCTION SITES

As every year, various roadworks will be opened this summer in the territory. Pay attention to the signage and follow the instructions of the signallers present for your safety and that of the workers on site.

Let us never forget that the job of a signaller exposes them particularly to the risk of an accident and that it is intended to ensure the safety of the entire population. Think of their safety as well; human lives are at stake:

- follow their instructions:
- allow a little more time for travel than usual:
- be courteous and respectful.

DITCHES

We want to remind residents living on a municipal street that any intervention in a ditch or on the curbside is prohibited, including extending the landscaping (i.e., grass or stone). Ditches are a part of the road's right of way and serve a specific purpose; their primary function is to capture and direct the runoff water. We suggest you leave the natural vegetation intact as much as possible. Backfilling it, lining it with river stones, or leaving material of any kind in it is also forbidden, such as grass clippings, branches, wood, sand, etc.

CULVERTS AND PRIVATE ENTRANCES

Considering the heavy rainfall in recent years, we see that water from some entrances flows directly onto our roads instead of flowing into the ditches, which greatly damages the state of our infrastructure.

In such a situation, it is your responsibility to make the necessary corrections to improve the situation. To do so, you must first obtain a permit, just as you would if you were working on or moving an entrance or installing or replacing a culvert.

Working together to improve water flow problems to preserve our infrastructure for as long as possible.

REDUCE YOUR WATER CONSUMPTION

Quebecers are, sadly, world champions of water consumption, and Morinheighters on municipal water networks are no exception. Over the summer, the average consumption in litres per person doubles, if not triples at times. Washing vehicles and various surfaces requires a lot of water, but excessive lawn watering is by far the activity that consumes the most. Therefore, it is vital that you respect the fixed watering schedule prescribed in *By-law 649-2022 concerning outdoor use of drinking water*, available on the municipal website (or see the table above).

The Municipality wishes to raise awareness regarding the use of drinking water. In addition to trying to attain the goal set by the province to reduce by 20% the average production of water per person, your efforts will also reduce the demand on our distribution networks, help preserve a natural resource essential to life and amount to collective and individual savings. There is no single solution, but rather a variety of suitable and complementary measures that will enable us to reduce your consumption.

Preparing an Emergency Kit for **Your Home**

Always have an emergency kit (e.g., a backpack or storage bin) at home with the items your family needs to survive for the first three days after a disaster. Place your emergency kit in an easily accessible location. Check its contents every year and replace the batteries and water supplies as needed, as well as any non-perishable food that has expired.

Here are the seven essential items to have in your emergency kit:

- drinking water (six litres per person);
- non-perishable food (for at least three days);
- · manual can opener;
- battery-powered radio and spare batteries;
- · headlamp or flashlights, spare batteries, or wind-up lamps;
- lighter or matches and candles;
- first aid kit: antiseptics, painkillers, adhesive bandages, sterile gauze pads, scissors, etc.

What to Do if an Electric Wire Has Fallen to the Ground?

Stay at a distance and never use an object to try to move the wire: even a tree branch can conduct an electric current. To report the presence of a wire on the ground, call 911.

Outdoor Fires

Before building an outdoor fire, make sure you follow the rules for an open-air fire.

An open-air fire is a fire that burns freely, for example, a ground-level campfire.

Before lighting an open-air fire, check with SOPFEU for any restrictions in effect. If there are no restrictions in your municipality, follow these guidelines:

- · prepare an open area on mineral soil, free of combustible materials (leaves, grass, etc.);
- make sure you have access to a water source (e.g., bucket of water, garden hose) at all times to put out the fire;
- keep all propane gas cylinders and other combustibles out of reach;
- keep an eye on the fire at all times and always have water nearby;
- put out the fire by dousing it thoroughly and stirring the embers:
- before leaving the premises, make sure there are no heat sources by touching the ashes.

Outdoor Fireplaces

If you have a regulatory outdoor fireplace, you can have a fire, even if SOPFEU restrictions are in effect in your municipality. To be in compliance, your outdoor fireplace must:

- be installed on a non-combustible surface (gravel, dirt)

AND

- be equipped with a spark arrestor with openings no larger than 1 cm.



It is important to note that the closed trails may be located on private property. Therefore, using them outside the operating season is **forbidden** since we do not have the necessary authorizations.

Unauthorized Development

Building modules, obstacles, or new trails in the mountain bike network is forbidden without the approval of the Municipality.

Hiking

The hiking trail network at Basler Park and Bouleaux Park (snowshoeing trails only) is free for all users.

Trail Conditions

You can check the status of the trails on the municipal website: www.morinheights.com/Outdoors. Please respect the 24-hour rule after heavy rain to preserve the trails' condition and respect the signage regarding closed trails.

Parking

Street parking is always prohibited, as well as on private lots adjacent to the parks. You must use the municipal parking lots near the various trail networks.

Emerging Artists Exhibition


A breath of creativity is blowing through Morin-Heights!


It takes a fabulous crew to put on a show! Over the decades, hundreds of volunteers have stepped up. Join our dynamic team. Here is how you can get involved.




Farewell to the Oldest Store in Morin-Heights
