Citizen Card

We invite you to get your citizen card now. This free card, valid for one year, will allow you to identify yourself as a citizen of Morin-Heights and will, among other things, give you access to some free services and/or preferential rates, for example:

- To obtain resident pricing for classes, gym sports and various activities:
- To provide you with free access to the outdoor tennis and pickleball courts as well as to the snowshoe and fatbike trails in winter:
- To give you access to Lummis Park;
- To facilitate access to municipal events and the future sports complex ;
- etc.

How to get it:

- Each family member must go to Chalet Bellevue during business hours (seven days a week, between 9:00 and 16:30) with proof of residency to finalize their file and have their picture taken.
- When moving away, it is the responsibility of the citizen cardholder, to notify the Municipality of any change of address by email or phone at the Chalet Bellevue.
- The expiration date is located on the back of the card. If the card has expired, it is important to keep it, as a sticker with the new expiration date will be affixed to the back of the card.
- At the time of renewal, the presentation of the card is mandatory, or a replacement fee of \$5 will be charged.

Dear fellow citizens.

As you know, almost two years ago, our municipal Council established an Environmental Advisory Committee (EAC or CCE). The purpose of the committee was to propose a draft Environmental and Transition Policy to Council.

This policy is a tool to guide Council, its administration and citizens in managing activities in a responsible manner and in accordance with the principles of sustainable development, i.e. taking into account the economic, sociological and environmental aspects of our municipality.

We are committed to preserving the unique environment of Morin-Heights.

Despite the context relative to the situation of Covid-19, the committee elaborated the first draft of the policy which Council accepted in August 2020.

The EAC has continued its work and is specifying action plans for the current and future years.

Therefore, I invite you to a public meeting to present to you the priorities, objectives and means proposed to continue to act now on preserving our environment and to better prepare for our future.

By participating in this meeting, you will also have the privilege of learning about the survey, which will be sent to citizens on future action plans regarding the environment and transition.

Finally, you will also have the opportunity to indicate your desire to get involved and collaborate with the EAC members. You can share your interests and expertise with all members of our community and your municipal Council.



Urban Planning and Environment

Waste Materials

From November to April, the frequency of waste collection is modified as follows:

- The brown bin will be emptied every two weeks;
- The waste bin will be emptied once a month;

However, there are no changes to recycling, and the collection remains bi-weekly.

To know your exact dates, consult your online calendar at lespaysdenhaut.com/services-aux-citoyens/environnement/calendrier-de-collecte/.

This reduction in collections began in the winter of 2020 in all ten municipalities of the MRC des Paysden-Haut territory and aims to:

- reduce the amount of waste going to landfills;
- increase the sorting of materials and the use of recycling and organic material bins;
- reduce greenhouse gas emissions;
- meet the objectives of the Residual Materials Management Plan (RMMP).

Despite the context of the health crisis, where consumption habits and our way of life have been disrupted, the figures obtained are very encouraging. Indeed, over the six months when the number of waste collections was reduced, i.e. November/December 2020, and January/February/March/April 2021, on the MRC territory, the weight of recycling

increased by 16% (20% in Morin-Heights) and compost by 33% (86% in Morin-Heights). In some municipalities, we note an increase of 129% for recycling and 119% for organic materials.

Indeed, there was also an increase of 1.5% in waste. But this increase is probably due to the presence of vacationers over a more extended period than in previous years, who took advantage of their second homes over several months. We also note that municipalities with a large proportion of second homes generated more waste overall during this pandemic period.

The MRC des Pays d'en-Haut thanks its citizens and businesses for their involvement and participation in reducing materials destined for landfill and hopes that everyone will continue their sorting and recovery efforts this year.

Outdoor storage

The Urban Planning and Environment Department reminds you that outdoor storage of firewood, recreational vehicles and domestic trailers is authorized in the back and side yards of a property previously occupied by a main building.

Street address

For your safety, if emergency services need to come to your home, please make sure that your civic address is visible from the public highway and that access to your property is unobstructed at all times. In an emergency, every second counts.

Septic tank

Snow being a good insulator, we suggest that you keep the snow on your septic tank covers during the winter period.

Storage of wheeled bins

We remind you that wheeled bins can be placed at the edge of your driveway from 17:00 on the day before collection and that they must be removed no later than 21:00 on the day of collection. No bin should remain on the side of the road outside of these hours.

In addition, on collection days, make sure to put the bins in your driveway and not in the street or on the sidewalk so as not to interfere with snow removal operations and traffic.

Public Works

The Municipality is seeking the population's cooperation to respect the municipal instructions and regulations for the winter period and thus allow our snowplows to intervene quickly and effectively this winter.

Streets Snow Removal

Snow removal and the spreading of abrasives are the main activities of the Public Works Department during winter. The speed of execution of these activities improves safety on our streets. For this reason, we remind you that when removing snow from driveways, parking lots, and pedestrian walkways, you must deposit snow on your private land and not on the municipal property so as not to interfere with snow removal operations. It is your responsibility to notify your private contractor. Anyone who contravenes this by-law is liable to a minimum fine of \$ 100 for a first offence (By-law 569 2019). Remember that parking is prohibited on all public roads, under penalty of a fine, and the risk of being towed at your expense.

Sidewalks Snow Removal

Snow removal on sidewalks and widening of roads is done with various vehicles and a snowblower. By-law 401 (available online) allows snow blowing on private properties.

Sanding

The mixture spread on the roads is made of sand in which is added 5% of salt and is generally applied once the snow has stopped falling. This mixture is more efficient and easier on the environment than salt alone, as salt is efficient only when temperatures range between 0°C and -15°C.

Temporary winter shelters and property markers

Be sure to set up your temporary winter shelter and markers <u>on</u> your property. The structures and markers installed in the street right-of-way interfere with snow removal operations and slow down operators' work. Choose wood or fibreglass poles since metal poles can damage snow removal equipment causing significant costs and delaying work. In addition, if breakages are caused to structures located within the municipal right-of-way, the Municipality cannot be held responsible for the damage because it is the citizens' responsibility to respect this area.

Collection of bins

We ask your cooperation to promptly put away your bins after collection (garbage, recycling, and composting). You must place your bins in your driveway and not in the street or on the sidewalk. The required distance is 1 to 1.2m (3 to 4 ft) between your bin and the roadway.

Courtesy and respect

During snow removal operations, we invite you to show courtesy by giving way to snow removal vehicles so that they can perform safe maneuvers during their various operations. During a loading operation, you should never overtake the convoy of trucks unless a flag person gives you permission to do so. Likewise, compliance with the flaggers' instructions is always essential during detours. The objective remains to accelerate all snow removal activities to allow users to regain full access to the public highway as fast as possible.

Structures or plants close to the road

Encroachment on the public road right-of-way

Property owners whose landscaping encroach on a portion of the street right-of-way must limit the use of that space to sod or access structures. These must not interfere with the Municipality's various maintenance operations, snow removal, hinder drainage, or constitute a nuisance to traffic or a danger to public safety.

Private property

Whether there is a fence, a hedge, or a flowerbed in front of your property, they must be protected in the fall. Note that the first metre inside your property line, not from the curb or the ditch, must remain free of any installations and structures. This clearance is required primarily for snow removal operations. This principle also applies to garbage, compost, and recycling bins.

All owners remain responsible for their installations bordering a road, and the Municipality will not accept any liability claims for damages incurred to these structures or plants.



Morin-Heights Fire Department and First Responders

Clearance of exits

In the event of a fire, being able to evacuate your home quickly is essential. In winter, the accumulation of snow or ice in your exits can interfere with evacuation.

- · After each snowfall, remove snow from your exits, balconies, patio and windows.
- Make sure windows are cleared of snow and thawed. A window blocked by ice can prevent escape.
- Plan a meeting point accessible in winter and visible to firefighters upon their arrival.

In a fire, you and your family may have less than three minutes to get out of your home safe and sound. Imagine the precious seconds you would lose if the exit you had to use during a fire was snowy!

- Ensure that windows that can be used as emergency exits are accessible from the inside to a young child and that the child knows how to open and access them.
- Make an evacuation plan for your home and practice evacuating with your family members to increase your chances of getting out safe and sound in a fire. www.quebec.ca/en/public-safety-emergencies/emergencysituations-disasters-and-natural-hazards/evacuate-your-home/homeevacuation-plan-fire.

Clear your exits from bulky items such as toys, shoes, school bags, shovels, snowblowers, barbecue, stored garden furniture, etc.



Reminders

- -> Have you thought about changing the batteries in your smoke detectors when you set your clocks back?
- -> Don't forget to have your chimney swept!
- ->Inform your municipality if the fire hydrant located near your residence is not cleared of snow.

The network: more than 160 km of cross-country ski, snowshoe and fatbike trails within your reach!

Cross-country skiing: Whether it's for classic, skate or off-trail cross-country skiing, we have trails that will allow you to take a nature break from various access points.

Snowshoeing: Several trails nearby (Basler Park, Bouleaux Sector, Sommet Morin Heights). You will find views of lakes, mountains, and ice rocks!

Fatbike: About fifteen kilometres are accessible; the passage of snowshoers maintains them.

Pricing (info on p. 13)

- Seasons passes can be purchased online.
- No charge for children 17 years old and under.
 - The Morin-Heights resident adult rate for a cross-country/snowshoe/fatbike pass has been reduced to \$50!
 - Access to the snowshoe and fatbike trails is free upon presentation of the citizen card (info on p.1 and 4)!

Landowners / Ski or snowshoe trails: Do you own a property with a municipal cross-country ski or snowshoe trail on it? Come to Chalet Bellevue (27 rue Bellevue) to receive free VIP passes for you and two of your guests (transferable guest passes).

Conditions and opening of the trails: Want to know the conditions? Visit morinheights.com/Outdoors. An update is made daily as well as the date of the last mechanical maintenance. Some conditions do not allow the use of the trails in order to preserve their quality or restoration; please respect these instructions when notices are issued. In addition, some trails have been modified. It is crucial to respect signage and private properties.

Ski school: It will be possible to take a cross-country ski initiation lesson or to master specific techniques! Equipment rental available. By reservation at 450 226-3232, ext. 130.

Equipment rental:

<u>Cross-country skiing:</u> the rental space will be located at 50 ch. du Lac-Écho in the Aerobic Corridor Pavilion.

<u>Snowshoeing:</u> at Basler Park's parking booth at 99 ch. du Lac-Écho.

Reminder about dogs: Dogs are allowed on snow-shoeing trails only and must be on a leash.

It is also possible to walk your dog at the Canine Corridor on chemin du Midi or at the dog park located at 100 chemin du Lac-Écho.




