

# **News from the Mayor**

Dear fellow citizens,

Once again, winter is at our doorstep; where did the summer go?

As I am writing this, our Recreation Department is preparing the Halloween party, which

will be concentrated on Village Road with a Mardi Gras theme (Jeudi Gras in our case!). We hope the young and not-so-young will have a great time.

I encourage everyone to participate in the Remembrance Day ceremonies in early November. Our Royal Canadian Legion, Local 171, does a remarkable job supporting our active military and commemorating our veterans. In today's global climate, they will be called upon to defend our freedom worldwide, and they need our support. Wear your poppy with pride!

Our alpine ski resort, Sommet Morin Heights, is getting a facelift this year with the replacement of the main chairlift ("Après-vous" for those in the know) with a fast quad chair with loading carpet. Skiers and snowboarders are in for a treat!

On the municipal front, a new triennial assessment roll will be filed this year. The value of your property is based on the sales values of similar properties and is done by accredited appraisers contracted by the MRCPDH. In many cases, you'll notice that your appraisal has increased significantly. It is important to note that an increase in assessment does not automatically mean an increase in taxes. The Municipality does everything in its power to limit increases by adjusting the tax rate downwards to counter assessment increases. The municipal budget normally follows the inflation rate, which is around 2% this year. A property that is within the average increase should, therefore, see a tax increase of 2%. If you believe that your assessment does not reflect the true value of your property, you will have until May 1st, 2025, to notify the MRC.

A year ago, I wrote to tell you that our 30-unit seniors' project, Habitat Morin-Heights, would soon be breaking ground. I'm pleased to inform you that construction is nearing completion, and the first residents will move in at the beginning of 2025!

This project has taken over five years to set up and will enable our seniors to remain in their community. I must thank the members of the volunteer board of directors: Mrs. Lucille Green, Mrs. Nicolem Bélanger-King, Mr. Raymond Roberge, Mrs. Louise Cossette, Mr. Hugo Lépine, as well as Mrs. Ève Robinson of the CISSS, Mrs. Agnès Grondin, MNA for Argenteuil, Mr. Stéphane Lauzon, MNA for Argenteuil-La Petite Nation, and our Minister responsible for Seniors, Mrs. Sonia Bélanger, who all believed in the project from the start and supported us through to completion. Thank you all so much!

On that note, I wish you a wonderful winter full of outdoor activities in the snowy Laurentians. We are truly fortunate to live in such a beautiful environment.

Your passes can be downloaded directly onto your card. A \$5 fee is charged for any card lost or renewed before its expiry date.

We are working hard to engage the goodwill of motorists, motorcyclists and trucks to reduce noise and improve the quality of life of our citizens.

As you know, our geographic location is both wonderful and challenging. Our roads are much appreciated, whether for exploring the Laurentians, travelling to Outaouais, or simply exploring the mountains of our magnificent region.

We know that this causes inconvenience for our citizens. Whether it's the motorcycles that travel our roads in groups, the trucks and heavy goods vehicles that use our roads to get from one village to another, or the many cars that come in during the summer season, the noise is constant, heavy, and very present.



# We explored all possible options

We talked to the *Ministère des Transports du Québec* and evaluated the possibility of a roundabout. We've asked for lower speed limits, installed sound meters and more. Nothing can be changed, and the reality remains the same: we are a central municipality with a large number of passers-by.



# We are working on raising awareness

We know that there will always be noise and constant traffic, but we're trying to improve the situation. In the last three years, we've put up billboards, an informative website, posts on social media, and other actions to reach out to passers-by.



Let's be ambassadors of our collective happiness. Let's drive gently, respect the limits, accelerate gradually and make the necessary efforts to minimize our noise impact. If we support these measures and ask our visitors to do the same, we'll slowly reduce noise and speed in our beautiful village.

We understand that an engine will always make noise, but we sometimes ignore that these small actions have a big impact when they are done collectively.



# **Environment**

Winter is settling in at Morin-Heights, and our beautiful landscape is gradually turning white. The first signs of the cold season are transforming our environment into an enchanting winter wonderland. This period also marks an important transition in our daily routines. To adapt to the winter season, we would like to remind you of a few good practices:

# **Civic Number**

To ensure and enhance public safety, especially during the winter season, it is essential that your civic number is displayed clearly and remains visible from the street. Snow accumulation during winter can reduce the visibility of civic numbers, so it is crucial to ensure their proper visibility. This allows emergency services (fire, ambulance, police, etc.) to quickly locate your residence if needed.

# **Winter Shelter**

Your shelter should be erected in the driveway of your parking area at a minimum distance of 2 meters from sidewalks, fire hydrants, and the roadway.

# **Snow Accumulation**

It is prohibited to push snow onto roadways and the shoulders of public roads. In addition to complicating snow removal operations, this practice can pose a safety risk to road users. Accumulated snow can reduce visibility and create obstacles, increasing the risk of loss of control and accidents.

# **Sanitary Installation**

To maintain the proper functioning of your sanitary installation, it is strongly recommended to let snow cover your leach field and septic tank. Snow acts as an excellent insulator, protecting your installation from freeze-related issues.

## **Firewood**

A maximum of 10 cords of firewood stored outside is allowed per property for residential use. Firewood must be stored only in the rear and side yards. It should be stacked and corded to a maximum height of 2 meters. The firewood should not obstruct any openings or exits.

# **Compost Bins**

Composting also adapts to the winter season! This time of year has the advantage of not causing odors, insects, or larvae inside the bin. However, cold and snow can make composting more challenging. Here are a few tips to make things easier:

- · To prevent your materials from freezing and sticking to the bin, we recommend lining the sides and bottom of the bin with pieces of cardboard.
- · Avoid placing liquids in the bin throughout the season.
- Wrap your wet food scraps in newspaper or cardboard to absorb moisture.

The inter-municipal Ecocentre is located at 2125 chemin Jean-Adam, Saint-Sauveur.

From April 1 to November 30: open every day (except Wednesdays), from 7:30 to 16:15.

From December 1 to March 31: open from Tuesday to Saturday, from 7:30 to 16:00.

During the Holidays, the Ecocentre will be closed on December 24, 25 and 26, and on December 31, January 1 and 2 inclusively.

# **Clearance of Exits**

In the event of a fire, being able to evacuate your home quickly is essential. In winter, the accumulation of snow or ice in your outdoor exits can interfere with evacuation.

- After each snowfall, remove snow from your exits, balconies, patio and windows.
- Make sure windows are cleared of snow and thawed. A window blocked by ice can prevent escape.
- Provide a meeting point accessible in winter and visible to firefighters upon their arrival.

In a fire, you and your family may have less than three minutes to get out of your home safe and sound. Imagine the precious seconds you would lose if the exit you had to use during a fire were snowy!

- Make sure that windows that can be used as emergency exits are accessible from the inside to a young child, and that the child knows how to open and access them.
- Make an evacuation plan for your home and practice evacuating with your family members to increase your chances of getting out safe and sound in a fire.

Clear your exits from all bulky items such as toys, shoes, school bags, shovels, snowblowers, barbecues, stored garden furniture, etc.

Check that the civic number of your residence is always visible from the public highway to facilitate the intervention of emergency services in the event of an emergency.

# **Civic Number**

Despite the accumulation of snow, make sure your civic address is visible at all times.



# Reminder

Have you thought about changing the batteries in your smoke detectors when you set your clocks back?

And don't forget to have your chimney swept!

# PREVENT FIRE HAZARDS WHEN DECORATING FOR THE HOLIDAYS

Keep the following prevention tips in mind for safe decorating during the festive season.



# CHRISTMAS TRFF

Choose an artificial tree because it is less likely to catch fire than a natural tree. If you choose a natural tree:

- Select a freshly cut tree, whose needles do not shed easily.
- Cut the trunk at an angle and place it in a container of water. Water it daily.
- Install the tree more than 1 metre away from all heat sources (electric baseboard, heater, fireplace, etc.).
- Unplug the Christmas lights when the tree begins to dry out.
- Please note that there is no Christmas tree collection in Morin-Heights and that the Ecocentre does not accept them. You will therefore have to dispose of your natural tree by your own means.



# **DECORATIVE LIGHTS**

- Choose lights that are certified by a recognized organization, such as the CSA or ULC, and choose low-heat-emitting bulbs, such as LED bulbs.
- Examine your lights before installing them and discard any that are defective, desiccated, or cracked and make sure your replacement bulbs have the same voltage as the old ones.
- Avoid putting indoor-use decorative lights outdoors, or vice versa.
- Plug any item used outdoors into a ground fault circuit interrupter (GFCI) outlet.
- Never overload the electrical system and use a timer or always unplug your decorative lights when you leave home or go to bed.
- After the festive season, bring in outdoor lights to prevent damage from the weather and sun. Decorative lights are not designed for long-term use.



# **EXTENSION CORD**

- If you must use extension cords, choose models approved by a recognized organization such as the CSA or ULC.
- Avoid cords that are too long and would need to be coiled, as the cable may overheat and cause arcing.
- If you must use an extension cord for your outdoor decorations, make sure it is designed for outdoor use.
- Do not overload outlets and extension cords. Use a power strip instead.
- Do not hide your extension cords under a rug or carpet. The weight of people walking on them and the friction they cause can damage the cord and increase the risk of fire.
- Do not leave an extension cord in a doorway. The insulation of the cord could be damaged if the door closes on it.
- Use only one extension cord at a time. Do not connect extension cords end to end.

# The Network: more than 160 km of cross-country ski, snowshoe and fatbike trails within your reach!

**Cross-country skiing:** Whether it's for classic, skate or off-trail (nordic) cross-country skiing, we have trails that will allow you to take a nature break from various access points.

The trails on the Viking Club territory (chemin Jackson) are also accessible; however, parking is limited.

**Snowshoeing:** Several trails nearby (Basler Park, Bouleaux sector, Sommet Morin Heights). You will find views of lakes, mountains, and ice rocks! Depending on the conditions, it is possible to walk with crampons.

# **Pricing**

- Seasons passes can be purchased online or at the Chalet Bellevue. Collect your 2024-2025 sticker at the Chalet after your online purchase.
- No charge for children 17 years old and under.
- Access to the snowshoe and fatbike trails is free upon presentation of the citizen card (info on page 3).

**Fatbike:** About fifteen kilometres are accessible; the passage of snowshoers maintains these trails.

Landowners / Ski or snowshoe trails: Do you own a property with a municipal cross-country ski or snowshoe trail on it? Come to the Chalet Bellevue (27 rue Bellevue) or send an e-mail to chaletbellevue@morinheights.com with your proof of residence and lot number to receive free VIP passes for you and two of your guests (transferable guest passes). Once your request has been submitted, processing time may take up to 7 to 14 days before your passes are issued.

Conditions and opening of the trails: Want to know the conditions? Visit morinheights.com/Outdoors. An update is made daily, as well as the date of the last mechanical maintenance. Some conditions do not allow the use of the trails in order to preserve their quality or restoration; please respect these instructions when notices are issued. In addition, some trails have been modified. It is crucial to respect signage and private properties.


# **Equipment rental:**

<u>Cross-country skiing</u>: the rentals are located at 27 rue Bellevue, in the basement of Chalet Bellevue. <u>Snowshoeing</u>: at the Basler Park booth located at 99 chemin du Lac-Écho.

Reminder about dogs: <u>Dogs are allowed on snow-shoe trails</u> only and must be on a leash. It is also possible to walk your dog at the Canine Corridor on chemin du Midi or at the dog park located at 100 chemin du Lac-Écho.




