That by-law 507-2012 be adopted as follows:

RÈGLEMENT 507-2013 REGARDING TARIFFS FOR SERVICES

WHEREAS The powers bestowed to municipalities by articles 244-1 and following of the *Municipal taxation Act* (L.R.Q., c. F-2.1);

WHEREAS That Council would like to update by-law 483-211 with regards to tariffs for services for the Fire department;

WHEREAS That as per articles 244.1 and following of the Municipal taxation Act (L.R.Q., c. F-2.1), the Municipality may stipulate that certain of its services be financed by way of tariffs;

WHEREAS The Municipality intends to invoice the costs of vehicle fire interventions to those not living on the municipality's territory and who do not otherwise contribute to this department's finances:

WHEREAS: A notice of motion with the exemption of its reading was given at its meeting of April 10th, 2013 by Councillor Jean Dutil:

CONSEQUENTLY, it is ordained and decreed as follows: <u>ARTICLE 1</u>

Article 1.4 of by-law 483-2011 is modified to be read as follows:

4. FIRE DEPARTMENT

4.1 The tariffs levied for the use of vehicles and equipment excluding manpower.

Tanker	250 \$ / hour
Pumper truck	250 \$ / hour
Rescue unit	150 \$ / hour
Service vehicles	50 \$ / hour
Off road vehicles	50 \$ / hour
Thermal camera	100 \$ / hour
Four-gaz detector	50 \$ / hour
Pumps	50 \$ / hour
Extrication tools	500 \$ / hour
Non durable assets	True costs

A minimum of one hour per vehicle sent to the location of an intervention, is required and invoiced.

The costs of manpower is required and invoiced as per the terms of the agreement entered into between the Municipality and the members of the Fire department.

4.2 Tariffs levied for an intervention destined to prevent of fight a vehicle fire of anyone not living on the Municipality's territory:

Tanker	300 \$ / hour
Pumper truck	300 \$ / hour
Rescue unit	200 \$ / hour
Service vehicles	100 \$ / hour
Off road vehicles	100 \$ / hour
Pumps	150 \$ / hour

A minimum of one hour per vehicle sent to the location of an invention, is required and invoiced.

The costs of manpower is required and invoiced as per the terms of the agreement entered into between the Municipality and the members of the Fire department.

15 Manpower

In any event, the cost of manpower is invoiced as per the hours worked by a municipal employee or if applicable, the minimum hours of a call stipulated in the agreement. The applicable rate is established as per the agreement in

effective with the addition of social fees, fringe benefits along with 15% administrative fees.

ARTICLE 2

This by-law modifies the provisions of Articles 1.4 and 1.16 of By-law 483-2011 and abrogates By-law 348 for all intents and purposes.

Considering Council has received a request for minor derogation to the parcelling by-law aimed at reducing the minimum required frontage on the provincial road for lot 3 737 949 (vacant lot, Route 364) as well as the reduction of the surface are of a derogatory lot, on lot 3 737 542 cadastre of Quebec:

Considering the request is aimed at the property located on lots 3 737 494 and 3 737 542 on Route 364, within zone 29;

Considering this request was studied by the Planning Advisory committee who partially recommend to Council the approval of the request to reduce the minimal required frontage on the provincial road as well as the reduction of surface area of a derogatory lot, by resolution 03-02-13;

Considering the Minister of transport issued an authorization for access to Route 364 for an entrance benefitting more than two properties;

Considering this request is associated to the approval of a cadastral operation and that following the Planning advisory committee, the developer presented a proposal concerning the transfer for parks purposes which was studied and recommended by the Service de l'environnement et des parcs;

Considering that according the Urbanism and development Act, those interested were invited by public notice to be heard at this consultation;

Consequently,

It is proposed by councillor Jean-Pierre Dorais And unanimously resolved by all councillors:

That Council grant the derogation with regards to reducing the minimum required frontage from 100 meters to 66,40 meters for lot no. 1 and to 66,41 meters for lot no. 2, as indicated on the draft parcelling plan prepared by surveyor Nathalie Garneau, minutes 0961, and recommends the reduction of the surface area lot 3 737 542 for projected lots no. 3 and 4, considering that the developer agrees to transfer to the Municipality, lot no. 4 for parks purposes and that lot no. 3 will be sold with lot no 1, therefore inseparable.
