51.03.16 MUNICIPAL COURT – RENEWAL OF THE AGREEMENT REGARDING THE OWNERSHIP OF FINES

Considering that the Minister, the DPCP and the Municipality have agreed to hold pilot project for a period of two years by which the City of Saint-Adèle and the Sûreté du Québec's municipal court has accepted to cooperate to deal with certain criminal infringements and that the project was the subject of a formal agreement between the above-mentioned parties, approved by decree 487-2014 of June 3rd, 2014;
