WHEREAS it is necessary to amend the borrowing regulations accordingly;

WHEREAS, in accordance with the 1st paragraph of Article 2 of the Act respecting municipal debts and loans (RLRQ, chapter D- 7), for the purposes of this bond issue and for loan by-law numbers 513-2014 – Paving work in Domaine des Bories and a loan of \$261,400 for this purpose, 500-2012 – Infrastructure and paving work in Domaine Balmoral, 618-2021 – Providing financing for the upgrading work on the Lac Peter dam decree of a loan for this purpose and 769 2025 – Providing financing for the purchase of a fire truck and decree of a loan for this purpose, the Municipality of Morin Heights wishes to issue for a shorter term than that originally set out in these by-laws;

It is proposed by Councillor Leigh MacLeod IT IS RESOLVED:

TO FINANCE the loan regulations indicated in the first paragraph of the preamble by bonds, in accordance with the following:

- 1. the bonds, one bond per maturity date, shall be dated October 21st, 2025;
- 2. interest shall be payable semi-annually, on April 21st and October 21st of each year;
- 3. the bonds shall not be redeemable prior to maturity; however, they may be redeemed with the consent of the holders in accordance with the Municipal Debts and Loans Act (CQLR, chapter D 7);

- 4. the bonds shall be registered in the name of CDS Clearing and Depository Services Inc. (CDS) and shall be deposited with CDS;
- 5. CDS will act on behalf of its participants as book-entry agent, bondholder agent, paying agent, and agent responsible for transactions to be carried out on behalf of its participants;
- 6. CDS will transfer funds in accordance with the legal requirements of the bond. To this end, the board authorizes the registrar-treasurer or treasurer to sign the document required by the Canadian banking system entitled "Authorization for the Pre-Authorized Debit Plan for Businesses";
- 7. CDS will make principal and interest payments to participants by electronic funds transfer and, for this purpose, CDS will directly debit the required amounts from the following account:

8. That the bonds be signed by the mayor and the registrar-treasurer. The Municipality of Morin Heights, as permitted by law, has mandated CDS to act as financial authenticating agent, and the bonds will come into effect only once they have been authenticated;

TO SET, with regard to the annual capital amortizations scheduled for the years 2031 and thereafter, the term provided for in borrowing by-law numbers 513–2014, 500–2012, 618–2021, and 769–2025 is shorter than that originally set, specifically, for a term of **five (5) years** (as of October 21st, 2025), instead of the term prescribed for said amortizations, each subsequent issue being for the balance or part of the balance due on the loan:

WHEREAS Quebec highway inspectors play an essential role in public safety, notably by monitoring heavy vehicles, ensuring compliance with hazardous materials transportation standards, conducting speed checks, and ensuring the safety of school buses and passenger transportation;

CONSIDERING THAT since the decision rendered on March 6th, 2025, by the Administrative Labor Tribunal (TAT), a significant portion of highway patrol officers' activities has been suspended or greatly reduced, particularly due to the confinement of these officers to checkpoints (weigh stations);

CONSIDERING THAT the summer period and the start of the school year are critical times on the road network due to heavy traffic, tourist transportation, and the massive return of school buses carrying children;

CONSIDERING THAT the Quebec government's inaction since the TAT ruling is a cause for concern and that concrete measures are needed to restore the full capacity of traffic controllers to intervene;

CONSIDERING THAT road safety is a responsibility shared between levels of government and that municipalities are committed to the safety of their citizens;

It amends article 129, table 29, line 12 to clarify the applicable standard for retaining walls.

It amends article 154 to adjust standards relating to natural spaces for businesses and vacant lots.

It amends article 164 to comply with the Professional Code (RLRQ, c. C-26) and the Forest Engineers Act (RLRQ, c. I-10) regarding tree felling.

It replaces existing article 182 with new text to comply with clarifications provided by the MRC concerning rockfall zones.

It modifies article 225, paragraph 3 and article 226, paragraphs 3 and 4 to clarify the standards applicable to acquired rights relating to the enlargement of buildings.

It modifies the specifications grid in Zone RV-31 in order to authorize the use of a small farm within this zone.

CONSIDERING sections 123 et seq. of the Act respecting land use planning and development (RLRQ, ch. A-19.1) on the procedure for amending a zoning by-law;

WHEREAS this by-law contains provisions subject to approval by persons qualified to vote;

- 1. The use must be located on a lot with a minimum area of 2,000 m², occupied by a single-family dwelling (H1) with a detached layout;
- 2. The use must be exclusively devoted to personal use, with no commercial or large-scale production activity;
- 3. The maximum number of beehives authorized is one (1);
- 4. The hive must be equipped with a mobile frame;

The hive must be located at a minimum distance of 7.5 metres from a street, lot lines and dwellings. \gg

5. **Retaining wall** – Paragraph a) of line 12 of table 29 of Article 109 is amended with the addition of the words $\ll 3$ m \gg of the following:

« The height of a retaining wall is measured from the lowest point of the adjacent natural ground (or the level of the backfilled ground if it is lower) to the highest point.

In the case of walls with successive steps (terraces):

- If the horizontal distance between the walls is less than 2 meters, the total height corresponds to the sum of the heights of all the walls.
- If the horizontal distance between the walls is equal to or greater than 2 meters, each wall is considered individually for the application of the maximum height. ≫
- 6. Location of a parking space for a use in the Residential group Paragraph 7 of Article 122 is amended by replacing, at the beginning of said paragraph, the word \ll Space \gg by the words \ll The boxes \gg and by replacing, after the words \ll single-family dwelling (H1) \gg , with the words \ll is prohibited \gg .
- 7. *Obligation to preserve natural areas* Article 154 is replaced by the following :
- ≪ 154. Obligation to preserve natural areas

Subject to the provisions of the present by-law, any deforestation or removal of the herbaceous, shrub or arborescent strata of a vacant lot is prohibited, unless a permit or certificate of authorization has been issued for authorized works. In such cases, clearing or removal of vegetation may only be carried out on those portions of the land strictly necessary for the authorized works.

Notwithstanding the first paragraph, deforestation or removal of herbaceous, shrub or arborescent strata may be authorized on an exceptional basis, when it is required to obtain data or information needed to process an application for a permit or certificate, in accordance with the requirements set out in the Permits and Certificates By-law.

Throughout the territory, natural areas on a plot of land must be maintained and preserved according to the following percentage, which varies according to the size of the plot:

For a land use in the Commerce, Industry or Public group, a minimum of ten percent (10%) of the land area must be preserved in its natural state. This requirement applies up to a maximum deforestation area of 15,000 square metres.

The calculation of the percentage of natural areas excludes the following areas:

- 1. The area corresponding to the purifying element, polishing field or discharge field required under the Regulation respecting wastewater assessment and treatment for isolated dwellings (RLRQ, c. Q-2, r.22) or the Environment Quality Act (RLRQ, c. Q-2), with the addition of a maximum 2-meter buffer strip at their perimeter. An additional area corresponding to the length of the pipes, from the treatment system to the discharge, over a maximum width of one (1) metre, may be excluded from the calculation;
- 2. The area corresponding to the immediate 3-metre protection zone for a water withdrawal installation and a geothermal system required under the Regulation respecting water withdrawal and protection (RLRQ, c. Q-2, r.35.2). An additional area corresponding to the length of the required pipes, over a maximum width of one (1) metre, may be excluded from the calculation;
- The area corresponding to the driveway leading to the parking spaces.

- 1. **Purpose** The purpose of the present by-law is to ensure the proper application of certain provisions of the Subdivision by-law particularly with regards to the recognition of an existing private street and the interpretation of standards applicable to lot shapes in accordance with the urban plan.
- 2. *Objective* The provisions of this By-law shall be interpreted in such a way as to promote flexible and consistent application of subdivision standards, particularly in relation to land with irregularities in the existing cadastre while ensuring the harmonious integration of recognized private streets into the municipal territory.

CHAPTER 2: AMENDING PROVISIONS

3. **Recognition of certain private streets** – Article 39 is amended by adding a recognized private street at the end of the chart:

Form of lots – Article 41 is amended by adding the following paragraph 4 after paragraph 3:

 \ll 4 The present provisions relating to the form of lots do not apply to land whose boundaries correspond to cadastral lines existing at the time of entry into force of this regulation. In the event of subdivision of such a lot, only the new projected lines shall comply with the requirements set out in this article. Thus, the creation of a new lot from an irregular lot is possible, provided that the new lines comply with the regulations. \gg .

4. **Entering into effect -** The present by-law enters into effect in accordance to the Law.

428.10.25 ADOPTION – BY-LAW (779-2025) WHICH MODIFIES BY-LAW (644-2022) REGARDING CONSTRUCTION TO CLARIFY CERTAIN DETAILS CONCERNING THE PLANS SUBMITTED WITH PERMIT APPLICATIONS

The Director general presents the by-law, gives a resume and notifies council of the adoption procedure to follow.

It is proposed by Councillor Peter MacLaurin And unanimously resolved by all councillors:

TO ADOPT the French and English versions of By-law (779-2025) which modifies By-law (644-2022) regarding construction to clarify certain details concerning the plans submitted with permit applications.

By-law (779-2025)

which modifies By-law (644-2022) regarding construction to clarify certain details concerning the plans submitted with permit applications

EXPLANATORY NOTE

The present by-law modifies By-law (644-2022) regarding construction to clarify the requirements relating to the signing of plans by professionals for certain types of work.

It amends paragraph 2 of Article 13 to clarify the cases in which plans must be signed and sealed by a professional who is a member of a recognized professional association.

CONSIDERING Articles 123 and following of the Act respecting land use planning and development (RLRQ, ch. A-19.1) concerning the procedure for amending a building By-law;

WHEREAS the council wishes to make certain adjustments to the Construction By-law in order to clarify the requirements relating to the signing of plans by professionals and to ensure compliance with the laws governing professional practices in the construction industry;

WHEREAS a notice of motion was given by Councillor Peter MacLaurin at the regular Council meeting on August 13th, 2025, and this draft bylaw was tabled and explained by the Director General;

CONSEQUENTLY, the municipal council decrees the following:

CHAPTER 1: INTRODUCTORY PROVISIONS

1. **Purpose** – The purpose of the present By-law is to ensure proper enforcement of the requirements for the submission of plans in connection with permit applications in accordance with the laws governing professional practices in the construction industry.

2. **Objective** – The provisions of the regulation must be interpreted in such a way as to ensure rigorous application of the requirements relating to the signing of plans in accordance with professional laws, while ensuring the quality and safety of authorized projects.

CHAPTER 2: AMENDING PROVISIONS

3. Compliance with building codes – Article 13 is amended by the replacement of paragraph 2 with the following: \ll Plans must be signed and sealed by a professional who is a member in good standing of a recognized order in the following cases: construction, expansion, addition of a dwelling, or any renovation that alters the load-bearing structure of a main building, as well as the construction of an accessory building with a surface area greater than 25 m². \gg and the addition of the following paragraph 3: \ll When required by the Architects Act (RLRQ, c. A-21), the Engineers Act (RLRQ, c. I-9) or any other law or regulation, plans must be signed and sealed by the professional referred to in those laws or regulations. \gg .

CHAPTER 3: FINAL PROVISION

4. **Entering into effect** - The present by-law enters into effect in accordance to the Law.

TO MANDATE Groupe Conseil UDA Inc. to develop the PEPPSEP Drinking water source protection plan, conditional upon the grant for said program being awarded to the Municipality;

TO AUTHORIZE the submission of an application for financial assistance under the PEPPSEP;

TO ACCEPT the project's contribution for park fees as mentioned above and TO ACCEPT the proposed transfer of servitudes and monetary contributed for this purpose conditional to the costs of the notarized deed and land registration be paid by the transferring property owner;

CONSIDERING the present SCAOPI request was processed following the provisions of By-law (648-2022) regarding SCAOPIs;

CONSIDERING the objectives of the urbanism plan have been respected;

CONSIDERING the location is within the residential and resort zone RV-18;

CONSIDERING the application involves the reconstruction of accessory structures such as a terrace and porch within a steep slope area;

CONSIDERING the application involves the addition of an accessory structure such as a three-season veranda within a steep slope area;

CONSIDERING the project is aimed at completely upgrading the derogatory constructions protected by acquired rights;

CONSIDERING the request aims at further stabilizing the embankment within a steep slope area;

CONSIDERING the added value of the project in terms of the superior and innovative quality of the materials used, especially for the retaining wall;

CONSIDERING the proposed landscaping will be of higher quality than the existing landscaping, due to the increased planting area;

CONSIDERING the serious harm that could be caused to the applicant if the application is denied;

CONSIDERING the urbanism advisory committee studied the project and recommend and express a favorable opinion;

WHEREAS the Municipality held a public consultation meeting on September 24th, 2025;

It is proposed by Councillor Claude P. Lemire IT IS RESOLVED:

THAT the preamble form an integral part of this resolution;

APPROVE the request from SCAOPI, lot 3 735 210, rue Riviera (4883-03-0712) for a depth of the lot of 49 meters, whereas the regulations in force require 60 meters, for the planned construction of an isolated detached single-family dwelling.

TO AUTHORIZE the mayor and the director general, and they are hereby authorized, to sign, for and on behalf of the Municipality, any document giving effect to this resolution.
