354.09.25 AUTHORIZATION TO INTRODUCE A PRIVATE BILL IN THE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY

WHEREAS the Municipality has been allowing the ≪Le Balmoral≫ residential development project for over 25 years;

WHEREAS the residential development project is adjacent to the ≪Le Balmoral ≫ golf course and is an integral part of Morin-Heights' identity;

WHEREAS this is a highly coveted development project in the MRC des Pays-en-Haut and contributes to Morin-Heights' reputation;

WHEREAS the majority of the «Le Balmoral» residential development project has already been built;

WHEREAS certain residual lots have remained part of the lot and have never been subject to a cadastral operation;

WHEREAS residual lots that remain part of a lot cannot benefit from the provisions regarding subdivision privileges set out in Article 256.1 of the Act respecting land use planning and development (LRQ, c. A-19.1);

WHEREAS the reference date for the application of Article 256.1 is December 7^{th} , 1983, which is prior to the approval of the \ll Le Balmoral \gg development project by resolution 278.07.89;

WHEREAS several lots were not described by boundaries for the first time until the 1990s;

WHEREAS these lots are located wholly or partly in a waterfront corridor and are not eligible for a minor exemption under section 145.2 of the Land Use Planning and Development Act, since these are regulatory provisions adopted under paragraphs 4 or 4.1 of the second paragraph of Article 115 of that Act; 1° of the second paragraph of Article 115 of that Act;

WHEREAS these lots cannot be the subject of a specific building, alteration or occupancy project (SCAOPI), considering that they do not comply with the provisions prescribed in the MRC des Pays-en-Haut land use and development plan, in accordance with Article 137.15 of the Act respecting land use planning and development;

WHEREAS several citizen owners have purchased lots on which construction will not be permitted, considering the absence of acquired rights, subdivision privileges, or compliance with the regulations in force;

WHEREAS the Municipality wishes to regularize the situation in order to authorize construction on the remaining lots in the « Le Balmoral »project;

CONSIDERING THAT the only means available to achieve these ends is to ask the National Assembly of Quebec to adopt a private bill allowing for future exemptions from the provisions of the specifications grid for zones \ll RV-23 and RV-24 \gg ;

CONSIDERING THAT the council's approval by resolution is essential to proceed with this request;

CONSIDERING THAT the Member for Argenteuil has agreed to sponsor the private bill proposed by the Municipality;

WHEREAS the members of the council have had an opportunity to review the said bill;

CONSIDERING Article 41 of the National Assembly Act (RLRQ, c. A-23.1);

CONSIDERING the provisions of Chapter 4 of the Rules of the National Assembly providing for the procedure for the adoption of private bills;

It is proposed by Councillor Peter MacLaurin IT IS RESOLVED:

THAT the preamble form an integral part of this resolution;

TO GIVE public notice of the introduction of the private bill as tabled;

TO AUTHORIZE its tabling in the National Assembly of Québec by the Member for Argenteuil;

TO ASK the Quebec National Assembly to proceed with its adoption.
