News from the Mayor

This edition being the last bulletin of the year, I would like to present the report on the Municipality's financial situation.

As of now, the electoral period is a thing of the past. The democratic health, as well as our community's financial health, is ensured. I would like to congratulate all of the candidates who have devoted their time and all of the citizens who have taken the time to vote.



l invite you to consult **www.morinheights.com** to find all documents pertaining to finances submitted to the *Ministère des Affaires municipales et de l'Occupation du territoire*.

The financial report for the year ending December 31st, 2016, prepared by our auditors Papillon et Associés Inc., reports an operating surplus of \$345,932, on a budget of \$9,024,347. This surplus stems mostly from the increase in property values and real estate transactions.

The accumulated surplus represents taxpayers' holdings. This year, the Municipality's worth has increased to reach \$19,332,575. The on-going infrastructure work to December 31st totals \$1,986,576.

Finally, the Municipality's debt to December 31st totaled \$9,254,997, for which \$464,673 has been paid for by the Quebec Government and \$4,912,009 by part of the taxpayers from their local improvement taxes.

During 2017, we have continued our infrastructure modernization program. Along with the annual road maintenance, the water pipes and road infrastructure were done on Village Road as per the gasoline excise tax reimbursement program.

The Public Works Department has also multiplied interventions in many other areas, and you must certainly have noticed the constant improvement in the road infrastructure, ditches and shoulders.

A lot of energy was focused on the transformation of Chalet Bellevue into a community center and sports chalet. In order to do so, we have benefitted from financial support from the Government of Canada as per the Canada 150 Program.

All local municipalities have delegated the waste management dossier to the *MRC des Pays-d'en-Haut*. We now divert from landfills: electronics, dangerous domestic products, mattresses and construction materials at the intermunicipal Ecocentre. Large items are also sorted and diverted to recycling businesses. The next step, which is the collection of compostable material, will be up and running in 2018 to meet the goals set by the Quebec Government.

Finally, financial activities are closely monitored, and we foresee ending 2017 with a slight surplus.

I would like to thank all Council members and municipal employees for their concerted and sustained efforts in providing the Municipality of Morin-Heights with modern infrastructure while minimizing the tax burden. I would also like to thank the tremendous volunteers who dedicate their time in the community's interest.

Here are some prevention tips:

- · Be skeptical about offers that seem too good to be true;
- Validate all information given to you;
- Gather as much information as possible about the seller: do not hesitate to ask a lot of questions, the more, the better;
- Arrange a meeting in a public place when completing your transaction;
- Always be accompanied by another person for your appointment;
- Do not show up if the seller changes places at the last minute for a more isolated area.

Training to Become a Day Camp Counselor



Parks and Trails

New Basler Park Trails: Work has continued on the trails in the new park. The new trails replacing the Lavabo, Rockcliff and Lollipop snowshoe/mountain bike trails will be a huge addition to the network. The new Lavabo passes in front of the lookout overlooking Lac Écho and is a masterpiece of trail design.

A new by-pass on the Bellevue return makes

skiing a joy and a major descent on the newly created Triangle has been softened and is much easier to handle. The Horizon ski trail from Lac Vert has been relocated and improved to be a much more enjoyable ski. A new section of the Portageur, from the Baldy to the Aerobic Corridor, replaces the difficult rocky section in front of the face of Mont Baldy and eliminates skiing through *Les Fondeurs* network.

The Aerobic Corridor between km 2 and 6 has been widened so that a BR can pass periodically when conditions are difficult and *Les Fondeurs* trail is being upgraded to meet FIS standards with the drainage being addressed in the fall and surface finishing in the spring.

A new map will be printed and available by mid-December.

Chalet Bellevue: The new headquarters for outdoors sports will be the Chalet Bellevue which features a new ticket booth, waxing room with ventilation, boot dryers, ample space for changing boots and showers. Welcome to "*La Capitale du ski de fond*"!

Dog Policy Amendment: After studying the situation last winter, it has been decided to amend the presence of dogs on the snowshoe network during the winter.

For the upcoming winter season (December 1st, 2017 to April 1st, 2018) dogs will be permitted on snowshoe trails, <u>except</u> during the weekends and Christmas holidays, <u>between 10:00 and 14:00.</u>

Ecocentre

The inter-municipal Ecocentre is located at 2125, ch. Jean Adam in Saint-Sauveur, 450 227-2451.

Services are free. You must present a proof of residence or ownership to the attendant.

New at the Ecocentre: Polystyrene is recyclable!

Good news! The days when we threw out our number 6 plastic containers and styro-

<complex-block>

foam items in the trash are over! It is now possible to bring them to the Ecocentre. These materials will then be transported to Groupe Gagnon in Prévost, where they will be dissolved and treated to produce new polystyrene.

By recovering these materials, you can significantly increase the lifetime of our municipal waste disposal site. Despite their low weight, these materials occupy a large amount of space in a landfill site. According to the *Régie Inter-municipale de Déchets de la Rouge* (RIDR), a ton of polystyrene takes up the equivalent of 35 tons of household waste! This simple little gesture makes a big difference.

The new materials accepted at the Ecocentre are as follows:

- **Rigid containers and food containers** such as plastic utensils and plates, small yogurt jars, fruit and mushroom trays, plastic wine glasses, small milk and coffee cream containers and any other #6 plastic containers.
- Styrofoam containers and food containers such as coffee cups, plates, meat trays and egg boxes.
- **Protective styrofoam packaging or "packing peanuts"** that can be found, for example, in the boxes of our new electronics or household appliances, vegetable crates from the garden centre and winter protection articles for outdoor plants.

Insulation panels used in construction, pink, green or blue.

Be sure to clean and rinse food containers thoroughly before bringing them to the Ecocentre. You must also remove labels, packaging films and absorbent pads.



Public Works

Your cooperation is key to ensure efficient snow clearing operations. Parking on public roads is prohibited at all times, so please respect this by-law to avoid a fine or being towed at your expense.

Streets snow removal

Snow removal and sanding operations are Public Works' main winter activity. Quick and efficient snow clearing improves safety on our roads. Therefore, we are reminding you that it is forbidden to shovel or plough snow onto municipal roads, sidewalks and in front of fire-hydrants. It is also your responsibility to notify your private snow removal contractor, as you may be held



accountable for any consequences resulting from his non-compliancy. Please note that during periods of freezing rain, trucks are chained and take longer to complete their run.

Sidewalks snow removal

Snow removal on sidewalks and widening of roads are done with various vehicles and a snow blower. By-law 401 (available online) allows snow blowing on private properties.

Sanding

The mixture we spread on roads is mainly made of sand to which we add 5% of salt and is generally applied once the snow has stopped falling. This mixture is more efficient and easier on the environment than salt alone, as salt is efficient only when the temperature is below -15°C.

Property markers

Markers for your driveway must be installed at the property limits rather than at the edge of the pavement. Opt for fiberglass or wood markers as metal ones can damage equipment, slow down operations, therefore increasing costs.

Structures or plants close to the road

Encroachment in the public road right-of-way

Property owners whose landscaping encroach on a portion of the street right-of-way must limit the use of that space to sod or access structures. These must not interfere with the Municipality's various maintenance operations, snow removal, hinder drainage, or constitute a nuisance to traffic or a danger to public safety.

Private property

Whether it's a fence, a hedge, or a flowerbed in front of your property, it is important to protect it in the fall. Note that the first meter inside your property line, not from the curb or from the ditch, must remain free of any installations and structures. This clearance is required primarily for snow removal operations. This principle also applies to garbage and recycling bins.

All owners remain responsible for their installations bordering a road and the Municipality will not accept any liability claims for damages incurred to these structures or plants.

Morin-Heights **Fire Department** and First Responders



In preparation for the holiday season, here are some fire prevention tips that will be useful when setting up your Holiday tree and decorations.

- → If you choose to use a natural tree, make sure that it is freshly cut. The needles should all be green and not come off easily.
- → Install the tree at a safe distance from busy areas and exits.
- → Do not install it too early so that it does not dry out before the end of the holiday season.
- → Place it in a container filled with water and add water daily. Dry pine trees can catch fire easily and quickly.
- \rightarrow Install the tree more than one meter away from any heat source or flame.
- \rightarrow Do not burn your tree in the fireplace or wood stove as it can leave significant creosote deposits in the chimney, which increases the risk of fire.



IMPORTANT REMINDER

Have you thought about changing the batteries in your smoke detectors when you set your clocks back?



When installing decorative lights, be sure to use only those that are approved by a recognized organization such as CSA or ULC.

- \rightarrow Make sure they are in good condition. Do not install garlands if the cord is damaged or dried, if the sockets are cracked or the connections are loose.
- → Do not install decorations or lights in front of your house number.
- \rightarrow Use extension cords approved by a recognized organization such as CSA or ULC. Avoid cords that are too long because when coiled, cables may overheat and cause an electric arc.
- → If you need to use an extension cord for your outdoor decorations, first make sure it is suitable for outdoor use.
- \rightarrow Be careful not to overload the electrical circuit.
- → Turn off the light decorations as soon as you leave the house or go to bed! The use of a timer is recommended.

Also:

- \rightarrow When you give a gift that requires batteries, provide it with the gift. Thus, no one will be tempted to remove the battery from the smoke alarm to operate the object.
- → Do not burn gift wrappers in the fireplace or wood stove. The inflamed paper can fly into the chimney, create a fire or settle on the roof or in the yard.

Exit routes

In case of fire, it is essential to be able to evacuate your home quickly. However, in winter, the accumulation of snow or ice outside your doors and windows can hinder evacuation. You could have less than three minutes to get out safely! To help ease evacuation in the event of an emergency, here are some safety tips:

- → After each snowfall, clear the snow from your exits, your balconies and your terrace.
- → Ensure that you have emergency exits other than the main doors, such as a balcony or a window, and make sure that the exit is cleared at all times.
- → Make sure windows are not only cleared, but thawed. A window trapped by ice can prevent evacuation.
- → Clear your exits inside and out. Bulky items such as toys, shoes, school bags, shovels, snowblowers, patio furniture, should be out of the way.
- → Check if older family members, experiencing a loss of autonomy, are aware of the risk of fire and if their emergency are cleared at all times.
- → If there is a fire hydrant on your property, avoid covering it during snow removal.
- → Check if your child's daycare center has an emergency exit other than the main exit and if the emergency exits are clear and cleared of snow.






