# News from the Mayor

My fellow citizens,

We are entering into the last year of our mandate with a lot of work to do.

Our first objective is to complete the renovation work at Chalet Bellevue for September 1st. The Government of Canada has seen the light and has agreed to provide us with a grant in the amount of \$500,000 in order to help complete the work. This grant will help the Municipality to reduce costs and allow the citizens of Morin-Heights to benefit from a cultural and community centre that would meet all of its needs. I would like to thank our Federal representative, Mr. Stéphane Lauzon, for his support in helping us obtain a positive response to our request.

The next major project will be the repairs to the aqueduct, sidewalks and pavement on Village Road, between Route 364 and Grand-Orme Road. This work should be completed by the fall.

Completion of the waterline and landscaping in the Sommet Morin Heights, Primeroses and chemin des Hauteurs areas will also occur during the month of June.

The Fondeurs' new training trail has been a major success. The first two cross-country races which were qualifications of the Quebec Games during the month of January and a Quebec Cup trial on March 11th and 12<sup>th</sup> proved that Morin-Heights is an undeniable competitive cross-country ski area and is considered as a provincial leader. We are the cross-country ski capital of the Laurentians! I would like to thank our partners: Club Fondeurs Laurentides, Caisses Desjardins and Les Sommets (versant Morin-Heights). This partnership proves what we can do in a short amount of time!



I invite you to take advantage of everything Morin-Heights has to offer; parks and trails to practice outdoor sports, library, municipal events such as the Children's Fishing Day and the Family and Environment Festival as well as various activities proposed by many of the community's organizations such as Arts Morin-Heights and the Historical Association's expositions.

In closing, on a philosophical note, I write these words following the terrorist attack in Quebec City. I hope that all citizens will step outside of their comfort zone a little more often to get to know their neighbours. Getting to know each other allows us to understand each other which means we can therefore live in harmony.

We live a good life here in Morin-Heights, in Quebec and in Canada. We must do whatever is necessary to maintain this wellbeing by remaining open-minded and welcoming. # I can go where I want, when I want!

L'Entraide bénévole des Pays-d'en-Haut allows you to do your groceries (\$8), your shopping in St-Jérome (\$13) or in Rosemère (\$15) on different days, depending on the municipality. Also, l'Entraide offers volunteer transport for medical appointments (\$). You can call 450 229-9020 or 1-855-226-5626 for more information.

If Entraide doesn't come to your area, you can take a **TAXIBUS** to bring you to the departure point of the Entraide transport for a cost of \$4. For example: Ste-Marquerite to Ste-Adèle; St-Adolphe to St-Sauveur; Ste-Anne-des-Lacs to St-Sauveur. Other routes are also available. Don't hesitate to call 1-877-604-3377.

Another option is *Transport adapté et collectif des Laurentides* which offers transport to and from medical appointments: 1-800-717-9737.

To take advantage of the services offered by these organizations, you must make a reservation (obligatory) and have the exact amount of money ready when you travel.

You can also travel from St-Jérome to Tremblant by bus (*l'Inter des Laurentides*); there are several departures a day with several stops, even on holidays: 1-877-604-3377.

Even Montréal isn't inaccessible! You can take the train from St-Jérome or the bus with Autobus Gallant, who offers the service between Montréal and Mont-Laurier with several stops along the way: 450 687-8666.

# Ruisseau Jackson: A Haven of Biodiversity

A new study on the natural resources in the area surrounding Ruisseau Jackson paints a picture of an ecosystem rich in biodiversity. In a brief visit to the area in the spring of 2016, 33 species of birds were identified! This sample is representative of the area's total biodiversity – the diversity of living species: flowers, insects, mammals, reptiles and so on. There are even a few rare species, such as the Pickerel frog.

The composition of the area covered by Ruisseau Jackson: Protected Natural Area (RJANP), which is connected to many of the region's natural environments, is nearly 84% intact forest, 7% wetlands and 3% water bodies. RJANP often organizes "nature discovery" events, so stay tuned: www.ruisseaujackson.org.

# **Town Planning and Territory Development**

# 2016-2018 Fleurons du Québec

It was with great pride that the Municipality obtained its fourth fleuron last October, after the presentation of the report by the classifiers who inspected our territory last August. These four fleurons recognizes a remarkable horticultural embellishment in the majority of categories. The upgrading of the flower beds under the entrance signs and the improvements made to Basler Park, the Aerobic Corridor and the library are responsible for the increase in scoring.

This recognition is the result of the subcontractors' hard work and their employees, including Mr. Gilles Saulnier, manager of horticultural development and Mr. Daniel Corbeil, responsible for lawn care. Congratulations on your dedication!

For the 2017 season, we will complete the landscape work we started last year at the library. We are also inviting all citizens to improve the greenery and beautify our territory.

# **Residential pools**

If you plan to install an above-ground, inground or temporary pool this summer, please consult the municipal regulations on our website or inquire at the Town Hall to learn about the particulars and find out which documents you need to submit along with your permit request. For lots supplied by one of the municipal water networks, a water tax of \$200 per year will be added to your 2017 tax bill.

Since the Beaulieu, Alpino, Loup-Garou and Salzbourg drinking water reservoirs are smaller and contain limited quantity of water, please contact Technical Services at 450 226-3232, ext. 115 to inform them of the date you've chosen to fill your pool and therefore avoid interruptions of water supply for other users of your network. Please note that any pool must be refilled during the night to avoid overloading the water system during high demand periods.

# Construction and renovation permits

Do you have a construction or renovation project in mind? Please call the Town Planning Department or visit our website to find out which type of work requires a permit before you start the project. An interactive permit request form can be found on our municipal website and submitted along with your documents, at the Town Hall or by e-mail.



Please note that in some areas, mainly at the heart of the village, renovation and construction is governed by a by-law regarding architectural integration. Work to be done has to be evaluated by the Town Planning Committee (CCU) and recommended to Council for approval. Allow additional delays when planning your projects.

# **Temporary shelters**

Residents have until May 1st to remove the protective tarp and until May 15th to dismantle the frame itself. The provisions apply to all temporary shelters no matter where they are installed on the property or what they are used for.

# **Tree cutting permits**

Cutting a tree on a private property, including dead and sick trees, requires a permit beforehand, which can be obtained free of charge. Please note that an inspection needs to be done to assess the validity of your request. If a tree is already down or you just want to prune a tree, you don't need a permit.

# Analyze the water in your well

Did you know that as the owner or operator of a water distribution system, you are required to provide users with drinking water that meets the requirements of the Provincial Drinking Water Quality Regulation Q -2, r.40? Think about analyzing the water in your well this spring.

The Ministry of Développement durable, de l'Environnement et de la Lutte contre les changements climatiques recommends two water analyses annually; in the spring and fall. To do so, contact the laboratories accredited by the Ministry. Again this year, we invite you at the Family and Environment Festival where you can benefit from a discount on the analysis of water samples from private wells, offered by the Municipality, in collaboration with the Laboratoire d'analyses Bio-Services.

# Renaturalization of the riparian zones

In order to prevent the emergence of blue algae, as some bodies of water in Quebec have experienced during the last decade, actions must be taken, such as the control of septic installations and the renaturalization of riparian zones. To this end, the Town Planning Department will inspect certain targeted waterfront properties and educate citizens about the benefits of water bodies, riparian zones and their health.

This inspection will help us to establish the situation of the riparian areas of certain bodies of water and to define the improvements to be made, if necessary.

We appreciate the cooperation and understanding of all Morin-Heights citizens and lake associations to help carry out this project.

# Fences, hedges, low walls, planting trees and flowers by the road

If you are planning to landscape near the road, installing a fence, erecting a wall or planting a hedge or trees in front of your property, make sure you ask if a permit is required. In most situations, the first meter inside your front property line must remain clear of structures and hedges.

Also, if you are planning to plant a tree at the edge of your property, make sure to use a suitable variety and respect the required setbacks from electric lines. Please consult Hydro-Québec's website: www.hydroquebec.com/trees/index.html to find tips and advice.

# Culverts, private entrances and ditches

Property owners looking to create or move a private entrance, install or replace a culvert must obtain a permit beforehand. Requests must be submitted at the Town Hall. A \$500 deposit is required at the time of the request, which is reimbursable once the project is completed by the owner, inspected and approved by the Municipality. Property owners must ensure the water can run freely in the ditch and we suggest you leave the natural vegetation intact as much as possible.

We would like to remind residents living on a municipal street with ditches, that any intervention in a ditch is prohibited without the authorization of the Public Works Department, including the extension of the landscaping (e.i. grass or stone). Ditches are a part of the road's right of way and serve a specific purpose. An intervention with unsuitable materials can cause damage to the infrastructure. Backfill or excess of material of any kind is also prohibited, for example, grass clippings, branches, wood, sand, river stones, debris, etc.



# **Public Works**

# Sweeper

Because we live in the Laurentians, large quantities of sand and small stones are spread on the roads because of icy winter conditions. We sweep the roads at the end of spring, but unfortunately cannot pick up the sand which extends onto the front of your property over the winter. Avoid making piles on the shoulders as our sweeper is not built to pick up such piles and could cause the equipment to break.

# Using public roads as a storage area

As a general rule, it is not allowed to use the public roadway, the curbside or the ditch to even temporarily store materials or to park vehicles and/or equipment. Under certain exceptional conditions, the Municipality can issue a daily occupation certificate. Please speak to the Town Planning Department to submit a request.

#### **Mountain Bike Trail Update**

Please respect the trail network by not biking on the trails until they are declared open as the damage can be extensive if the ground has not fully dried out. The opening date will be posted on the board at the base of the mountain and on our website. Your cooperation is appreciated.

There will be a substantial amount of new trail building this summer to replace the trails that are being lost in the new subdivision. All the trail markers have been removed from the trails that are to be abandoned as home construction will begin this spring in the area.

It is for this reason that we are planning our work bee for Sunday June 11th, so that we can layout and pre-cut the new trails ahead of time and focus on finishing work during the work bee.

Signage in the new sector will be matched to the signs that were installed at the beginning of the network last summer.

Due to major renovations underway at Chalet Bellevue, the building will not be accessible this summer. If all goes well, it will be in operation this autumn.

# **Spring Cleaning**

Once the snow has melted, it's time to pick up the debris left on the ground. Be aware that the municipal open fire regulations specify that burning debris, building materials, leaves and pine needles are prohibited. These items can be taken back to the Ecocentre, recycled or composted.

If you do make a fire to get rid of branches, shrubs, trunks etc., be sure to obtain a permit at the Town Hall beforehand. All relevant regulations governing open fires within the municipality's territory are explained on the back of the permit, which is free and valid for a period of four days.

As in previous years, in 2017, firefighters will conduct residential prevention visits to ensure that your smoke and carbon monoxide alarms are functional and to provide you with fire safety advice.
