BY-LAW 535-2016 LIGHTING IN DOMAINE BALMORAL

Considering the Domaine Balmoral property owners association have presented the Municipality with a project regarding streetlights;

Considering such a project aims at promoting safety and showcasing the Domaine;

Considering the entire Domaine is subdivided and that these lots cannot be subdivided because of the minimum required surface area;

Considering all streetlights will be integrated into the Municipality's public streetlight network;

Considering a notice of motion for this by-law was given at the regular council meeting of May 11th, 2016 with the exemption of its reading by Councillor Leigh MacLeod;

THAT THE FOLLOWING BE STATUED AND ORDAINED BY THE PRESENT BY-LAW, as follows:

The preamble forms an integral part of the present by-law.

ARTICLE 1

Council decrees an expense not exceeding the amount of \$ 180,000 for the applying of the present by-law, specifically the purchase and installation of streetlights and park benches on the roads within the Domaine and in order to obtain this amount, authorizes a loan by banknotes for the same amount for a period of 10 years; the estimated quote dated May 4th, 2016 prepared by the Director general, Mr. Yves Desmarais, attached herewith as Annex A forming an integral part hereof.

ARTICLE 2

If any of the appropriations of the present by-law is more than the expense made pertaining to this appropriation, Council is authorized to use this surplus to pay for other expenses decreed by the present by-law and for which the estimate is proved to be insufficient.

ARTICLE 3

In order to provide for the expenses committed pertaining to interests and reimbursement in capital of the annual due date of the loan, is by the present by-law levied each year during the term of the loan from each of the 225 taxable properties located within Domaine Balmoral, on Augusta, Balmoral, Doral, Glen Abbey, Grand Cypress, Pinehurst, Riviera and Saint-Andrews roads, as shown on the plan of roads and the list of properties attached herewith as Annex B of the present by-law forming an integral part hereof, a compensation for each taxable property for which he is the owner.

The amount of this compensation will be established annually by dividing the allocated expenses with regards to interests and the reimbursement of capital on the annual due dates of the loan by the number of taxable properties for which the property owners are subject to the payment of this compensation.

ARTICLE 4

Every taxpayer of properties on which a tax will be levied as per Article 4 may have this property exempt of this tax by paying the amount of the capital of this loan in one instalment before the first issuance of this loan or any other subsequent issuance, if applicable, which would be provided by the required compensation as per said article.

The payment must be made within thirty days of the issuance of the notice sent by the Municipality and forwarded by mail to taxpayers concerned by the present by-law. The special tax will be levied by the present by-law and deducted in accordance. This payment must be made as per Article 1072.1 of the Quebec municipal Code.

A payment made before the above-mentioned term exempts the property from the special tax for the remainder of the term of the loan set by the bylaw.

ARTICLE 5

The present by-law enters into effect as per the Law.
